Beijing has approved the establishment of the China Postal Savings Bank to take over the post office's predominantly rural financial services system. The bank will be China's fifth-largest deposit-taking institution. China Postal Savings Bank will manage a network of 36,000 outlets nationwide - twice as many as Industrial and Commercial Bank, the country's largest lender. About 60 per cent of its outlets are in rural areas. In a statement on its website yesterday, the China Banking Regulatory Commission said the new bank will be wholly owned by China Post Group, which was recently registered with capital of 80 billion yuan. In July last year, the State Council approved a blueprint to separate the regulatory and business functions of the 87-year-old State Post Bureau. China Post Group will handle all the business functions of the postal system. The CBRC hailed the move as "an important achievement in China's banking reform". At the end of 2005, there was more than 1.3 trillion yuan in deposits in the postal savings system, 9.56 per cent of the domestic deposit base, ranking the bureau just behind the four biggest state-owned lenders. Ai Baojun (艾宝俊)

Ai Baojun will become president of Baosteel Group, China's No1 steelmaker, in line with the board decision made on 15 January 2007, *People Daily* reported. He is president of Baosteel's Shanghai-listed arm, Baoshan Iron & Steel. (SCMP, 16 Jan 07)

Cai Jianjiang (蔡剑江)

Vice-President Cai Jianjiang will replace Ma Xulun as president of Air China, the country's largest international carrier. The board has approved the appointment, the company said. Tan Zhihong would take over as vice-president, Air China said. (SCMP, 2 Feb 07)

He graduated from China Civil Aviation Institute in 1983.

The equity reform signals the start-up of the company's five-year development from 2006 to 2010. Founded in July 2003, PICC Asset Management had total assets worth CNY 45 billion under management as at end-2006, with return on investment hitting 10.5% in the year, according to chairman Tang Yunxiang. It is to launch third-party services, to act as manager for public capital and to invest at abroad in the near future. The third-party assets are expected to account for 30% of the total managed by PICC AMC by the year 2010. The company expects to launch infrastructure construction investment products and wealth management products for insurance institutions in due course. The plan is subject to the approval of China Insurance Regulatory Commission. Ren Daode, president of PICC AMC, said that the company's financial strength and corporate governance have been improved after the equity reform, paving the way for it to develop into a top investment and wealth management player at home and abroad. Munich Reinsurance AMC, which currently has EUR 190 billion assets under management, has rich experience and expertise in operating insurance capital. PICC AMC's largest shareholder PICC Holding is former People's Insurance Company of China founded in 1949, which was renewed and re-registered as PICC Holding in 2003. China Life Insurance Asset Management Company Limited, jointly owned by China Life Insurance (Group) Company and China Life Insurance Company Limited (China Life), is the largest insurance asset management company in the country.

Xie was the highest-ranking official to be removed from office for an environmental incident. Around 100 tons of pollutants containing hazardous benzene spilled into the Songhua River after a chemical plant explosion on 13 November of 2005 in northeast China's Jilin Province. The incident forced cities along the river, including Harbin, capital of Heilongjiang Province and a city of more than three million people, to temporarily suspend water supply. The CCP Central Commission for Discipline Inspection is investigating into Du's case. The commission found clues of Du's malpractice after receiving reports from the public during an official routine inspection.

Du was born in March 1950 in Longkou, Shandong and joined the CCP in December 1972. The economically booming Shandong's gross domestic product (GDP), which ranked the second place in the country only after the southern Guangdong Province, reached to 1.02 trillion yuan (127.5bn US dollars) in the first half of 2006, a year-on-year growth of 15.3 per cent.

Qingdao, a regional international shipping centre in Shandong, is the country's second largest foreign trade port and a co-host city of the 2008 Olympic Games. The port's throughput is expected to exceed 200m tons this year, ranking Qingdao one of the world's top ten ports. The city is also headquarters of some renowned Chinese brands such as appliance manufacturer "Haier" and the "Tsingtao Beer".

Du's sacking is another signal of the central government's hard stand against official malpractice and corruption. Earlier this month, Beijing's former vice mayor Liu Zhihua, who was sacked in June for corruption, has been expelled from the CCP. In September, the sacking of Shanghai party chief Chen Liangyu for alleged involvement in a social security fund scandal, has become the country's highest-ranking official to fall in the latest anti-corruption campaign. Later, Qiu Xiaohua, former statistics chief, was removed from the National Bureau of Statistics for his suspected involvement in the 10bn-yuan (1.25bn US dollars) Shanghai social security fund fraud. In 2005, 115,000 party members received disciplinary punishment, accounting for 0.16 per cent of the party's total. Among them, 11,071 had been expelled from the party, of which 7,279 had been transferred to the judicial authorities for criminal investigations. (XNA, 24 Dec 06; RMRB, 25 Dec 06)

Guan Guoliang

Resigned from his post as chairman of New China Life Insurance amid a probe of suspected misuse of funds, state media reported on 28 December 2006. New China Life Insurance, established in August 1996, ranks fourth in China in terms of life insurance market share, after China Life Insurance, Ping An Insurance and China Pacific Insurance, Xinhua said. Jia Changbin

Beijing, Feb. 7 (Xinhua) - Jia Changbin has been ordered to resign from his post of general manager of the China Aviation Oil Holding Company (CAOHC) for his involvement in a scandal concerning the Singapore Exchange, for which he was found guilty by a Singaporean court in 2004. The State-owned Assets Supervision and Administration Commission on Tuesday announced Jia's successor as head of the heavyweight jet fuel supplier as Sun Li, the former chief of the chemical and marketing business of the China National Petroleum Corporation. Jia and his former deputy Chen

Jiulin, who was also chief executive of CAOHC subsidiary China Aviation Oil (Singapore), were found to have failed to inform the Singapore Exchange of its massive losses of 550 million US dollars from oil derivative trading. Chen was sentenced to four years and three months in jail and fined 335,000 Singapore dollars (about 207,443 US\$). He is currently serving his sentence in Singapore. Jia escaped imprisonment but was fined 400,000 RMBY (about 51,282 US\$). "We will learn from the lesson of the Singapore incident, improve the governance of the parent company, tighten risk assessment and improve the company's performance," Sun told Xinhua. Despite the shadow of the Singapore incident, the CAOHC still raked in 7.22b US\$ in revenue last year, reporting profits of nearly 128.5m US\$, Sun said. The CAO (Singapore) has been restructured and resumed trading on the Singapore stock exchange after being suspended for 16 months. British energy company BP and a subsidiary of Singapore's government-related investment company Temasek Holdings are the new shareholders of CAO (Singapore), but CAOHC still holds the majority share. The news did not affect the CAO (Singapore) share price which closed at 1.040 Singapore dollars on Wednesday, the same as the previous day. Established on October 11, 2002, CAOHC is one of the 159 centrally-administered large state-owned enterprises (SOE). (XNA, 7 Feb 07; SCMP, 8 Feb 07)

Xie Qihua, known as the "Iron Lady", has finally stepped down as chairwoman of Baosteel Group, China's No1 steelmaker, according to the official *People Daily* website. Her departure came well past the retirement age under guidance from the State Council, the country's cabinet, the website said. Replacing her as chairman is Xu Lejiang, the 48-year-old Baosteel director and president, who in December 2004 took over from Ms Xie as company president and in May last year as chairman of the group's Shanghai-listed arm, Baoshan Iron & Steel. Ms Xie, 63, stepped down because of her age. China typically requires executives at state-run companies to retire at 60. Ai Baojun, president of Baosteel's Shanghai-listed arm,

will become the group president in line with the board decision made yesterday, *People Daily* reported. Related personnel changes involving Baoshan Iron & Steel would be announced soon after the relevant procedures and regulatory approvals were made, the paper said without providing details. Ms Xie's resignation would not shock the market, said analysts on 15 January, noting that the move was well expected and prepared - the central government had progressively arranged younger management to take up Mr Xie's workload. Born in Shanghai in June 1943, Ms Xie graduated from the civil engineering faculty of Qinghua University in 1966 and went to work as a technician at Shaanxi Steel before joining Baosteel in 1978, when Deng Xiaoping took over the Communist Party and decided to build a steel plant in Shanghai. Less than 20 years later, Baosteel had become the world's No6 steelmaker. Under the stewardship of Ms Xie - as president since 1994, and chairwoman since 2000 - its assets had more than tripled to 142 billion yuan at the end of 2005 from 39 billion yuan in 2000, and net profit had quadrupled to 12.7 billion over the same period. For the three years to 2005, the group had been among *Fortune* magazine's list of the world's 500 biggest firms. Ms Xie, one of a few female chief executives in an industry dominated by men, was rated in 2005 by *Forbes* magazine as one of two Chinese among the world's top 50 businesswomen. She will leave her successor the job of reaching her target of making Baosteel one of the top three steelmakers in the world by 2010, and overseeing its overseas listing. (SCMP, 16 Jan 07)

The president of Guangdong Development Bank has resigned and will join China Merchants Bank next year, Reuters reported on 13 December 2006. Zhang Guanghua, president of Guangdong Development, tendered his resignation to the bank's board on 11 December, weeks after a Citigroup-led consortium won management control of the bank in a US\$3.06 billion deal. The resignation has been approved, Reuters said, citing unnamed sources. Zhang will join China Merchants Bank, one of China's leading joint stock commercial banks, at the beginning of 2007 as an executive vice president, the report said. ... Zhang Guanghua was appointed as the president of Guangdong Development Bank in August 2002. Before he took the position, he had worked in the State Administration of Foreign Exchange and People's Bank of China. In recent years, he has led the rather weak lender aim for better performance. Statistics show the bank had a before-tax profit of 1.68 billion yuan (US\$213 million) during the first half of this year, a year-on-year growth of 200 per cent. Today, the lender has 27 branches nationwide with 502 outlets. It has assets of US\$47.9 billion with 12 million consumer customers, 9 million cardholders and 16,000 small and medium-sized enterprise clients. China's State Council decided on 12 January to appoint **Tang King-shing** Commissioner of Police of Hong Kong Special Administration Region (HKSAR), replacing Lee Ming-Kwai. The decision was made based on the nomination and recommendation by Donald Tsang Yam-kuen, HKSAR Chief Executive and based on HKSAR Basic Law. (XNA, 12 Jan 07; RMRB, 13 Jan 07; SCMP, 12, 13 Jan 07) Tang, 52, a deputy commissioner, will take up his new post on 16 January when Lee steps down.

Deaths

Beijing, 16 January: Senior Chinese politician **Bo Yibo**, who served in several key posts including vice-premier, has died in Beijing at the age of 99, an official statement said on 16 January. "Bo died of illness at 20:30 on 15 January in Beijing," the statement said. Born in Shanxi Province in 1908, Bo joined the CCP at the age of 17 and lived to be the Party's oldest member. "Bo had been a member of the 7th, 8th and 11th CCP CCs, alternate member of the Politburo of the 8th CCP CC, and vice-premier of the State Council," the statement said. It said Bo was also deputy head of the former Central Advisory Committee. "Bo was an excellent CCP member, a great Communist warrior, a great proletarian revolutionary and a prominent leader in the Party's economic work," the statement said. After the new Chinese republic was founded in 1949, Bo led the country's economic work and was later elected honorary president of the China Council for the Promotion of International Trade. Bo also wrote a two-volume book, which featured his memories of CCP policy making during some key historic events. Bo Xilai, his son, is currently China's Minister of Commerce. Bo Yibo was one of the „eight immortals“. The "eight immortals" refer to paramount leader Deng Xiaoping [1904-1997] and his political contemporaries, including former president Li Xiannian [1909-1992], former NPC chairman Peng Zhen [1902-1997], former economic boss Chen Yun [1904-1997], army general Song Renqiong [1909-2005], former president Yang Shangkun [1907-1998], former vice-president Wang Zhen [1908-1993] and former vice-premier Bo [1908-2007]. All were Long March veterans and all were victims of the Cultural Revolution. During the Tiananmen protests in 1989, the immortals were seen as influential in pushing for a crackdown on pro-democracy students. Bo was also said to have played a crucial role in ousting reformist party leaders Hu Yaobang and Zhao Ziyang during the late 1980s and the installation of a more conservative leadership headed by Jiang Zemin in the wake of the crackdown. A host of senior Chinese officials turned out on 22 December to bid a final farewell to **Zhang Dingfa**, former navy commander of the People's Liberation Army (PLA), who was cremated at the Babaoshan Cemetery in Beijing.

Zhang, a member of the Central Military Commission, died on 14 December aged 63. He was honoured as "excellent" member of the Chinese Communist Party (CCP), a time-tested, loyal Communist fighter and an excellent leader of naval modernization.

President Hu Jintao, Vice-President Zeng Qinghong, and other state, party and PLA leaders, including Zhou Yongkang, He Guoqiang, Guo Boxiong, Cao Gangchuan, attended the funeral.

Zhang, joined the PLA in 1960 and was admitted to the CCP in 1964. He was an alternate member of the 15th and 16th CCP CCs. He was promoted to admiral of the PLA navy in 2004. (XNA, 22 Dec 06; RMRB, 23 Dec 06, 22 Jan 07)

Australia (Jan 04)

Australian companies could begin exporting uranium to China starting early next month, after the two countries ratified key agreements on nuclear energy, Foreign Minister Alexander Downer said on 4 January. In a brief statement, Mr Downer said Australia and China had ratified two agreements - the Australia-China Nuclear Transfer Agreement and the Nuclear Co-operation Agreement - through an exchange of diplomatic notes in Beijing on 4 January. "The agreements will enter into force 30 days after ratification," he said. "Accordingly, the legal framework for Australian uranium producers to commence exports to China is expected to be in place early this year." Mr Downer said the timing and quantities of exports would be a matter for commercial negotiation. (SCMP, 5 Jan 07)

Benin (Jan 01)

The Chinese foreign minister, Li Zhaoxing, signed three financial agreements during a 24-hour visit to Benin. ... The funding is especially meant for the reduction of Benin's debt towards China. It involves a loan of 2.9m euros, approximately 17.4bn CFA francs and a financial aid agreement for the development of the Beninese administration and for the construction of road infrastructure. Brazil (Jan 09)

The Brazilian Institute of Geography and Statistics (IBGE) and the State Bureau of Surveying and Mapping of China (SBSM) will sign a technical and scientific cooperation agreement on 9 January. The accord is aimed at improving both sides' cartography and Geographic Information Systems (GIS), as well as their environmental monitoring techniques and research. A Chinese committee has come to Brazil for the signing of the agreement, which is to take place at IBGE headquarters in Sao Paulo. SBSM's

Director General Lu Xinshe will lead the group, which is scheduled to visit IBGE's Geodesy and Cartography sectors on 9 January. On 10 January, the committee will fly to Brasilia for a meeting with Brazil's Minister of Environment Marina Silva. (XNA, 9 Jan 07)

Cameroon (Jan 31)

... After the talks between visiting Chinese President Hu Jintao and his Cameroonian counterpart Paul Biya, Hu and Biya witnessed the signing of eight bilateral cooperation documents, covering economic and technological cooperation, health, education and telecom areas. ... (XNA, 31 Jan 07)

Canada (Jan 16)

Chinese and Canadian officials signed an agreement in Beijing to strengthen scientific cooperation in the field of energy, biotechnology, health, environment and agriculture. The agreement was signed by Xu Guanhua, China's minister of science and Canadian International Trade Minister David Emerson. Emerson said Canada will invest 5.25m Canadian dollars (about 4.65m US dollars) to support bilateral scientific cooperation. The two countries will also promote dialogue and cooperation in the field of intellectual property rights protection, according to the agreement. (XNA, 16 Jan 07)

Kazakhstan (Dec 20)

... After the talks between Chinese President Hu Jintao and visiting Kazakh President Nursultan Nazarbayev, the two heads of state signed the China-Kazakhstan Cooperation Strategies in the 21st Century and the Blueprint for China-Kazakhstan Economic Cooperation and Development, and attended the ceremony for the signing of documents on cooperation, including the agreement on the Chinese-Kazakh border management system reached between the Chinese Government and Kazakh Government. ... ... During Nazarbayev's stay in Beijing, the two countries issued their bilateral cooperation strategy for the 21st century and a blueprint for economic cooperation, as well as 11 cooperation agreements covering trade, energy, science and technology, culture and education. ... (XNA, 21 Dec 06)

Macedonia (Jan 04)

China and Macedonia signed an agreement on economic and technical cooperation to strengthen ties between the two countries, news reaching here from Skopje reported. Dong Chunfeng, the newly-appointed Chinese ambassador to Macedonia, and Vera Rafajlovska, Macedonian economy minister, on behalf of their respective governments, inked the agreement, under which China will grant an aid worth 2m euros (2.44m dollars) to Macedonia. Dong said that China would like to do what it could to help Macedonia's efforts in building its economy and society, hoping that the bilateral relations between the two countries can be lifted onto a new level.

... Rafajlovska said that Macedonia highly appreciated the economic aid, hailing the Chinese help as sending charcoal in snowy weather. "This is another indicator of successful bilateral cooperation between the two countries," Rafajlovska said, adding this is the second grant agreement between China and Macedonia. The first one was signed in September 2004. Rafajlovska also expressed her satisfaction with the amicable bilateral relations between the two countries, and invited Chinese companies to invest in Macedonia. (XNA, 4 Jan 07)

Philippines (Jan 15)

Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao and Philippine President Gloria Macapagal Arroyo reached a wide range of consensus in their talks on developing relations between China and the Philippines. They also attended signing ceremony of a number of cooperation agreements by officials of the two countries. ... The deal signed by the two countries included a framework agreement on expanding and deepening bilateral economic and trade cooperation, an agreement on economic and technical cooperation, a framework agreement on provision of concessional loan by China to the Philippines, an agreement on protection of cultural heritage, and three agreements on China providing loan and contracting for building two railway lines in the Philippines. Tajikistan (Jan 15)

China and Tajikistan have signed a treaty on good neighbourliness, friendship and cooperation. China's President Hu Jintao and Tajik President Emomali Rahmonov, who arrived in Beijing for a seven-day state visit, signed the document following their talks in the Great Hall of the People. Agreements on technical and economic cooperation, air services between the two counties, an agreement on opening a line of credit between the China Bank for Development and the National Bank of Tajikistan, and an additional protocol to the cooperation agreement in the education sphere were also signed. China also undertook to supply Tajikistan with mobile systems for customs control. A Sino-Tajik investment forum is to take place in Beijing on 16 January. ... (ITAR-TASS news agency, Moscow, 15 Jan 07, in BBC PF, 16 Jan 07)

United States (Dec 16)

China and the United States signed a memorandum of understanding for Westinghouse Electric Co. to provide technology for four nuclear power units to be built in China. The memorandum of understanding was signed by China's Minister of the National Development and Reform Commission (NDRC) Ma Kai and U.S. Energy Secretary Samuel Bodman. "The pact was signed to ensure the introduction of technology and the smooth construction of the nuclear power plants," according to a statement released by the NDRC. The U.S.-based Westinghouse will provide China with the AP1000 technology, a light water nuclear reactor which has an advanced design and an automatic system to deal with

emergencies. The deal was signed on the sidelines of a five-country energy ministers meeting in Beijing. (XNA, 16 Dec 06; RMRB, 17 Dec 06)

International Agreements

The signing of the China-ASEAN agreement on trade in services is a major step forward in building the China-ASEAN free trade area, said a spokesperson with the Chinese Commerce Ministry on 14 January 2007. China and the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) countries signed The Agreement on Trade in Services of the China-ASEAN Free Trade Area in Cebu, the second largest city of the Philippines, on 14 January. The spokesperson said China and ASEAN countries would further open the services sector, providing improved market access for each other following the agreement. The signing was another major achievement in China-ASEAN economic cooperation and trade, said the spokesperson, adding it has laid the foundation for the completion of the China-ASEAN FTA on schedule. Under the agreement, China will allow auto maintenance companies from ASEAN countries to set up wholly-owned subsidiaries in China. ASEAN countries can set up foreign-owned sewage treatment and garbage disposal companies in China. Singapore and Brunei have opened the maritime transport sector to Chinese companies and some ASEAN countries have opened the hotel and catering sector, allowing Chinese companies to set up joint ventures there. The spokesperson said consumers in China and ASEAN countries would have more choice in services, while companies in related sectors would improve competitiveness by going global. In recent years, China and ASEAN countries have seen frequent exchanges in sectors such as education, transport, energy, culture and medical services. All the 10 ASEAN member countries have become approved destinations for Chinese tourists. The spokesperson said the China-ASEAN agreement on trade in services is the first of its kind under a FTA framework between China and other countries. China has initiated negotiations to build 11 free trade areas, involving 28 countries and regions. The China-ASEAN free trade area comprises Brunei, Cambodia, China, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, the Philippines, Singapore, Thailand and Vietnam. It is scheduled to be completed by 2010. Upon completion, it will become the world's third largest free trade area after the European Union and the North American free trade area. (XNA, 14 Jan 07; RMRB, 15 Jan 07)

China Mainland Agreement with Taiwan (Dec 27)

Chinese mainland issued a set of regulations offering Taiwan journalists more convenience to report on the mainland in the run-up to and during the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing. The regulations, issued by the Taiwan Affairs Office of the State Council, will come into force on 1 January 2007, and expire on 17 October 2008. Similar regulations have already been issued for foreign journalists reporting on the 2008 Olympics. Under the new regulations, Taiwan journalists who hold valid Olympic accreditation cards and passes to the mainland are entitled to multiple entries. To interview organizations or individuals in China, Taiwan journalists need only to obtain their prior consent, the regulations said. They may, through relevant service organizations, hire mainland citizens to assist them in their reporting activities, according to the regulations. (XNA, 27 Dec 06)

China Mainland Agreement with Hong Kong and Macau (Dec 30)

Chinese authorities issued a set of regulations offering journalists of Hong Kong and Macau more convenience to report on the Chinese mainland in the run-up to and during the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing. Hong Kong and Macau journalists can hire mainland citizens to assist them in reporting on the mainland in the run-up to and during the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing, according to the new regulations issued by the Hong Kong and Macau Affairs Office of the State Council. Journalists from the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (SAR) and Macau SAR may, through relevant service organizations, hire mainland citizens to assist them in their reporting activities, the regulations said. To interview organizations or individuals in China, Hong Kong and Taiwan journalists need only to obtain their prior consent, the regulations said. Under the new regulations, Hong Kong and Macau journalists who hold valid Olympic accreditation cards and passes to the mainland are entitled to multiple entries. The regulations will come into force on 1 January, 2007, and expire on 17 October, 2008. Similar regulations have already been issued for foreign journalists reporting on the 2008 Olympics on 1 December and for Taiwan journalists on 27 December. (XNA, 30 Dec 06; full text of the regulations: RMRB, 31 Dec 06)

...According to the regulations issued in 1989, Hong Kong journalists are required to apply through Xinhua in Hong Kong 15 days in advance if they want to report on the mainland. However, in reality, few journalists follow the rules and ask for permission as this usually proves difficult and time-consuming. The new regulations also allow Hong Kong reporters to hire mainlanders to help them. But an official from the Hong Kong and Macau Affairs Office said mainland citizens could only work as assistants to the journalists and were unlikely to

be granted press accreditation. Cai Wu, director of the State Council Information Office, said the regulations might be extended once the Olympic Games are over. (SCMP, 31 Dec 06)

China Mainland Agreement with Hong Kong (Jan 08)

Hong Kong and the Chinese mainland signed an agreement on cooperation in oceanography to enhance forecasting of hazardous oceanic events. Deputy Director of the State Oceanic Administration (SOA) Chen Lianzeng and Director of the Hong Kong Observatory (HKO) Lam Chiu-ying signed the agreement. Chen said the SOA and HKO will exchange data and technology on the observation and forecasting of typhoons, storm surges, wind waves, sea fog and tsunamis. Historically, storm surges associated with typhoons have wreaked havoc on China's coast including Hong Kong many times. Also, tsunamis generated by undersea earthquakes, and sea level change and climate change due to global warming are topics of common interest to SOA and HKO. "A partnership between SOA and HKO will enhance our capabilities in forecasting and warning about hazardous oceanic events, for the purpose of preventing and mitigating disasters and for the protection of lives and properties," Lam said. Exchange of tropical cyclone information between SOA and HKO dated back to the 1980s. To raise public awareness about tsunamis, SOA and HKO cooperated last year to translate the popular scientific publication "Tsunami -The Great Waves" into Chinese on behalf of the International Tsunami Information Centre of the Intergovernmental Oceanographic Commission of UNESCO, and published the booklet on the mainland and in Hong Kong. The signing of the agreement will facilitate further systematic cooperation between the two parties. (XNA, 8 Jan 07)

Hong Kong Agreement with Kazakhstan (Dec 22)

The Hong Kong SAR Government signed an Air Services Agreement with the Government of the Republic of Kazakhstan in Hong Kong. Secretary for Economic Development and Labour of Hong Kong Stephen Ip signed the agreement on behalf of the Hong Kong government. While Minister of Transport and Communication of the Republic of Kazakhstan Serik Akhmetov represented the Government of the Republic of Kazakhstan at the signing ceremony. Kazakhstan, strategically located between Asia and Europe, is Hong Kong's first aviation partner in the Central Asia region. ... The Air Services Agreement with Kazakhstan is Hong Kong's 58th Air Services Agreement with foreign aviation partners. (XNA, 22 Dec 06)

PRC Laws and Regulations

Beijing, 31 December: China will see in the New Year with up to 59 new laws and regulations that will go into effect on 1 January 2007, ranging from death penalty reviews to financial crimes.

The 28 central and 31 local level laws and regulations would better "ensure the country's opening-up and safeguard human rights," according to the Chinacourt.com, a website sponsored by China's Supreme People's Court.

All death penalties imposed by provincial courts are required to be approved by the Supreme People's Court starting from 1 January. The Supreme People's Court would review the evidence, laws and regulations application, measurement of penalty, and the litigation process in the trial and hear the defendant out either in person or by letter, before reaching the final decision.

Money laundering in foreign markets costs the country 200bn yuan (25bn US dollars) each year, and the Anti-Money Laundering Law along with the People's Bank of China's regulations for financial organizations requires the establishment of a client identification system that will record all client data and transactions from 1 January.

The Standing Committee of National People's Congress also revised provisions on the banking industry, granting banking industry authorities the right to investigate individuals and organizations to curb other forms of financial crimes.

Regulations issued by China's State Council suspend, from 1 January 2007, to 17 October 2008, the requirement for overseas journalists to apply to provincial foreign affairs offices for permission to report in all provinces of China, demanding instead that they need only obtain prior consent of the organizations or individuals they want to interview. Overseas journalists who are non-residents would not need to be accompanied or assisted by a Chinese official or a Chinese host institution when they report, and hire Chinese citizens to assist them in their reporting activities through organizations providing services to foreign nationals.

Other important laws and regulations which will go into effect include the Passport Law, Measures for the Administration of the Refined Oil Market, Measure for the Administration of the Crude Oil Market and Banking Supervision Law. (XNA, 31 Dec 06)

Law of the People's Republic of China on Protection of Minors,

adopted at the 25th meeting of the 10th NPC Standing Committee on 29 December 2006. The law will come into effect on 1 June 2007. (Presidential Decree No. 60, signed by State President Hu Jintao on 29 December 2006) (Full text of the law: RMRB, 10 Jan 07) This law consists of seven chapters with 72 articles.

The revised law requires teachers and other school staff to respect children and prohibits corporal punishment and humiliation of students. The law prohibits schools from prolonging study times and increasing student workloads, and to ensure adequate sleep hours and sports activities for pupils. Another aim of the law is to protect children's personal safety. One of its provisions states that if accidents occur in activities organized by schools whether on or off campus, school authorities must immediately assist the children and report the accident to the authorities. The law also requires people's courts to set up special tribunals to try cases involving under-age offenders. It bans the sale of tobacco, alcohol and pornographic publications to children aged under 18, and prohibits the opening of Internet bars and dance halls near middle and primary schools. (XNA, 29 Dec 06)

Measures for paying litigation costs. These measures will take effect as of 1 April 2007. (Decree No.481 of the PRC State Council, signed by Wen Jiabao, Premier of the State Council, on 19 December 2006) (Full text: RMRB, 6 Jan 07) The measures consist of eight chapters with 56 articles.

Provisional Regulations of the People's Republic of China on the Taxation of Vehicles and Ships, adopted at the 162nd State Council's executive meeting on 27 December 2006. These regulations will take effect as of 1 January 2007. (Decree No.482 of the PRC State Council, signed by Wen Jiabao, Premier of the State Council, on 29 December 2006) (Full text: RMRB, 1 Jan 07) The regulations consist of 14 articles.

Provisional Regulations of the People's Republic of China on Taxes on Urban Land Use, adopted at the 163rd State Council's executive meeting on 30 December 2006. These regulations will take effect as of 1 January 2007. (Decree No.483 of the PRC State Council, signed by Wen Jiabao, Premier of the State Council, on 31 December 2006) (Full text: RMRB, 1 Jan 07) The regulations consist of 14 articles.

The Chinese government has decided to raise tax rates on urban land use by two times from those set in 1988 in a bid to rein in the excessive development of urban land. Premier Wen Jiabao signed an order of the State Council on 31 December to revise the provisional regulations on taxes on urban land use issued in 1988. The increased tax rates will be applied to domestic businesses, foreign-funded enterprises in China and foreign companies. China's economy grew 10.7 percent in the first three quarters this year, with fixed assets investment surging 27.3 percent. The government

believes checking excessive growth of credit and land supply could be an effective way of cooling the economy. Measures have been taken to tighten land supply in the second half of the year, including higher taxes on urban land use and stripping local governments of their authority to spend the money from land sales. (XNA, 1 Jan 07)

Provisions on Appraising Public Servants (for trial use). The provisions consist of six chapters with 31 articles. (Full text: RMRB, 20 Jan 07)

The People's Bank of China, or the central bank, on 29 December issued **new individual foreign currency regulations**, in a bid to facilitate individual foreign exchange transactions. The regulations, which will come into effect on 1 February, 2007, impose an annual quota on foreign exchange settlements of individuals, abolishing the previous limit for every single settlement transaction. For transactions within the annual quota, individuals can handle foreign exchange settlements directly in a bank. Beyond the quota, settlement transactions under current account must go through the inspection of a bank and those under capital account are subject to the foreign exchange authorities. The annual quota will simplify the procedures for individual foreign exchange settlements, said a central bank spokesman, adding that China put an annual quota on foreign exchange purchases by individuals in May, resulting in an increase of 210 per cent in purchases in May to November over the same period last year. The new regulations aims to facilitate foreign exchange flows in personal trade, by allowing individuals to open settlement accounts and treating personal traders the same as trading companies. No quotas are imposed on foreign exchange settlements or the purchases of personal traders that are registered with the commerce authorities. The regulations also provide guidance for capital account transactions of individuals. Mainland residents can entrust banks, fund management companies and other domestic financial institutions to invest in financial products overseas, including stocks and bonds, according to the regulations. The annual quota also applies to capital account foreign exchange settlements and purchases of individuals. China will gradually relax restrictions on capital account foreign exchange transactions as the country continues to make the Renminbi convertible under capital accounts, said the spokesman. The foreign exchange authorities will strengthen the monitoring of foreign exchange transactions, especially those that are big and suspicious, and crack down on money laundering and other criminal activities, said the spokesman. (XNA, 29 Dec 06)

Beijing, 1 January: In accordance with the decision on amending the Organic Law of the People's Courts, adopted by the 24th meeting of the 10th NPC Standing Committee, the Supreme People's Courts begins the exercise of unified power of approving cases of death sentence on 1 January 2007. Earlier, the Supreme People's Court on 28 December 2006 promulgated the **provisions in the "Decision on Relevant Issues Concerning the Exercise of Unified Power of**

Approving Cases of Death Sentence". Effective 1 January 2007, aside from death sentences adjudged by the Supreme People's Court according to law, cases of death sentence ruled and adjudicated by all higher people's courts and the Liberation Army Military Court according to law should be reported to the Supreme People's Court for approval. Meanwhile, eight circulars concerning authorization of the higher people's courts and Liberation Army military courts to approve some death sentence cases, which were promulgated previously according to the law, are clearly annulled. The eight circulars are: the circular concerning several specific provisions authorizing the higher people's courts to approve death penalty on several kinds of active criminals; the circular concerning several items for implementing the NPC Standing Committee's "Decision on the Issue of Approving Death Sentence Cases"; the circular concerning authorization of the higher people's courts to approve some death sentence cases; the circular concerning authorization of the Yunnan Provincial Higher People's Court to approve some death sentence cases of narcotics criminals; the circular concerning authorization of the Guangdong Provincial Higher People's Court to approve some death sentence cases of narcotics criminals; the circular concerning authorization of the Guangxi Zhuang Autonomous Regional, Sichuan Provincial, and Gansu Provincial Higher People's Courts to approve some death sentence cases of narcotics criminals; the circular concerning authorization of the Guizhou Provincial Higher People's Court to approve some death sentence cases of narcotics criminals; and the circular concerning authorization of the higher people's courts and Liberation Army military courts to approve some death sentence cases. "The Supreme People's Court's exercise of the unified power of approving death sentence cases is an important policy decision made by the central authorities by proceeding from the strategic height of building a socialist harmonious society, further consolidating the party's foundation of governance, and realizing long-term order and stability in the country; and it is a key measure for implementing the constitutional principle, 'the state respects and protects human rights', in the judicial system, as well as a major aspect of fulfilling the international human right convention," said Xiao Yang, president of the Supreme People's Court. Meanwhile, he said: After exercising the unified power of approving death sentence cases, the Supreme People's Court will enforce the law strictly, punish criminal offenders precisely, control and apply death penalty prudently, and unify the standard of applying death penalty, in order to ensure the quality of trials of death sentence cases, maintain social stability, and promote social harmony. Beijing, 3 January: China's Supreme People's Court (SPC) has just issued a set of **new regulations to improve effectiveness in enforcing court rulings**. The new regulations set a time limit of six months for executing court rulings involving property. Applications to defer an execution must be submitted to the SPC five days ahead of the deadline. Court officials should instruct the parties concerned to

report and register their properties within three days of receiving a ruling, according to the regulations. Courts should take prompt measures to prevent relevant parties transferring, hiding, selling or damaging their properties during the enforcement period. Courts are asked to verify the exactitude of registered properties within five days. For those who cannot provide evidence, courts should start an investigation 10 days after they submit their applications. The income, bank deposits, securities, immovable properties, vehicles, machinery, intellectual property rights, and investment earnings of people affected by a court ruling should be investigated - as well as their debt situation - and the investigation should last no longer than one month. The court is also obliged to host public hearings if the party that applies to enforce a ruling is not satisfied with the execution result. All the legal documents and related materials, except those involving state or commercial secrets, produced during the enforcement period shall be made available to the parties concerned for reference and copying. The new regulations will help enhance the effectiveness and transparency of the enforcement of court rulings, a knotty problem in China, said an SPC official. They will also help strengthen supervision of enforcement work and ensure fairness, he said. (XNA, 3 Jan 07)

Beijing, 3 January: China's **new adoption rules** are not meant to restrict the number of foreigners who can adopt Chinese children, but to ensure that kids receive the best possible family care, according to an official with the Ministry of Civil Affairs. Lu Ying, director of the China Centre for Adoption Affairs (CCAA) under the ministry, explained that China now has far fewer children available for adoption by foreign couples. "More domestic families have adopted children from our centre in recent years and economic and social development has meant that fewer children have been abandoned or orphaned," Lu said. According to international conventions, preference is given to domestic families rather than foreign couples. The number of foreigners applying to adopt a child in China has increased, and they usually have to wait 14 to 15 months, Lu said. "The new rules will help shorten waiting time for qualified foreigners and speed up the process for children, especially the disabled, so that they can go to their new families, where they can get better education and medical treatment, more quickly," he said. The rules have been made in the interests of the children, to guarantee them optimal family conditions, he said. The new rules, to take effect on 1 May, 2007, make it more difficult for overweight, single and economically precarious foreigners to adopt. They give priority to stable, well-off foreign couples aged between 30 and 50. Reports by foreign media said the new rules were aimed at curbing the number of foreigners who can adopt Chinese children. Xing Kaimin, an official with the CCAA, denied this, saying that the new criteria were meant to protect children's interests and not to show prejudice against less qualified applicants, who can still apply. Obese people, for example, are more likely to suffer from disease and might have a shorter life expectancy, which is not without consequence for the life of the adopted child, China Daily quoted

Xing as saying. The new rules will also provide a reference for foreign adoption agencies, which can offer preferential arrangements for qualified families and improve efficiency, Lu said. Lu said the priority criteria might be modified over time. (XNA, 3 Jan 07)

Beijing, 9 January: China's People's Liberation Army (PLA) has implemented a **new regulation to strengthen the influence of the Communist Party within its ranks**. A circular issued by the PLA's General Political Department on 9 January requires military and armed police personnel to study and implement the regulation on the work of the Communist Youth League of China (CYLC) in the PLA. "We should guard against weakening of the League's role in the PLA," says the circular. According to the regulation, the fundamental aim of CYLC organizations in the army is to train high-quality young armymen with ideals, a strong moral character, advanced knowledge and a strong sense of discipline and strengthen the party's influence among young armymen. The circular says that in implementing the regulation, approved by the Central Military Commission, efforts should be made to enhance the enthusiasm and creativity of young CYLC members in the army to conform with China's military reform. The CYLC, which is under the direct leadership of the Chinese Communist Party, is considered to be the party's "assistant" and "backup". The League had 72 million members at the end of last year, of which 49 per cent were students. (RMRB, 8 Jan 07; XNA, 9 Jan 07)

Beijing, 22 January: **Foreigners in China require government approval before conducting mapping surveys, according to a regulation** issued on 22 January. "Foreign organizations and individuals, who engage in surveying and mapping must obtain approval from the central government and accept supervision from local governments above the county-level," said a regulation issued by the Ministry of Land and Resources. Chinese law on surveying and mapping states that foreigners must cooperate with a Chinese partner and the activities must not involve state secrets or jeopardize national security. The regulation forbids foreigners from conducting land surveys, aerial photography, mapping of administrative borderlines and the drawing of navigation maps. The number of foreigners conducting surveying and mapping in China is on the rise and many field projects have been carried out illegally, which have threatened the security of the country, said the ministry without mentioning the number of such cases. Last year, two Japanese scholars were fined a total of 80,000 yuan (10,000 US dollars) and deported for collecting materials and coordinates of an airport and water facilities in Xinjiang Uighur Autonomous Region. It was feared their results could be put to military use. According to the State Bureau of Survey and Mapping, foreigners who illegally survey, gather and publish geographical information on China will be severely punished. Chinese partners or translators will be fined if they fail to stop illegal mapping activities. (XNA, 22 Jan 07)
