China National Machinery Industry Corporation (SINOMACH), established in January 1997 with the approval of the State Council, is a large state-owned enterprise group integrating technology, industry, trade and financial services into one entity. SINOMACH, consisting of major companies and institutions attached to the former Ministry of Machinery Industry, is now under direct control of the State Assets Supervision and Administration Commission of the State Council. The **People's Bank of China** established its Shanghai Headquarters in August 2005.

**Wang Daohan**, president of the mainland-based Association for Relations Across the Taiwan Straits [and member of the Central Taiwan Affairs Leading Group], passed away in Shanghai on 24 December. Wang died of disease in the Shanghai Ruijin Hospital at the age of 90. Wang, native of Jiashan, Anhui Province in east China, once served as secretary of the CCP Shanghai Municipal Committee, vice-mayor and mayor of Shanghai, and adviser to the Shanghai Municipal People's Government. He was a member of the former CCP Central Advisory Commission, delegate to the 13th, 14th and 15th CCP National Congress, and deputy to the 5th and 6th NPC. The Association for Relations Across Taiwan Straits was founded in December 1991, and Wang took the presidency. In April 1993, Wang and Koo Chen-fu, chairman of the Taiwan-based Strait Exchange Foundation (SEF), held in Singapore the first ever high-level, non-governmental talks across the Straits. The talks were known as the Wang-

Koo meeting. In October 1998, they held the second talks in Shanghai and reached a consensus on four points involving dialog across the Straits on political issues. Wang also served as professor of economics with many prestigious universities including Beijing University, Fudan University and Tongji University. Fond of reading, Wang had done considerable research into politics, economics and management and had wide interest in literature, history, music, arts and drama. (XNA, 24 Dec 05; RMRB, 25 Dec 05)

**Yao Wenyuan**, member of the Gang of Four in China's 1966-76 Cultural Revolution, has died. He was 74. Yao died of diabetes on 23 December 2005. He was sentenced to twenty years imprisonment by a special tribunal of the Supreme People's Court in 1976, with political rights deprived for five years. He was released from prison in October 1996 after serving full jail term. Yao was the last member of the Gang of Four which refers to Wang Hongwen, Zhang Chunqiao, Jiang Qing, Yao Wenyuan. The youngest gang member, Wang Hongwen, died of liver cancer in a Beijing hospital in 1992 while serving a life sentence. Zhang Chunqiao died of cancer on 21 April 2005, at the age of 88. He was given death sentence with a two-year reprieve by a special tribunal of the Supreme People's Court in January 1981, and his sentence was commuted to life imprisonment with political rights deprived for life in January 1983, and was commuted again to 18 years in prison with political rights deprived for 10 years. Jiang Qing was sentenced in 1981 to death with two-year reprieve. But the verdict later commuted to life in prison. Ten years later she hanged herself while on medical parole. ## Cambodia, Laos, Myanmar (Dec 11)

China signed exchanges of letters on special and preferential tariff treatment with Cambodia, Laos and Myanmar. According to the documents, starting from 1 January 2006, some categories of goods exported to China from the three countries will enjoy zero-tariff treatment. The preferential policy will apply to 83 categories of goods from Cambodia, 91 categories of goods from Laos and 87 categories of goods from Myanmar. Chinese Vice-Minister of Commerce Yu Guangzhou signed the exchanges of letters respectively with representatives of these countries, namely, Cambodian Minister of Commerce Cham Prasidh, Laotian Minister of Commerce Soulivong Daravong and Myanmar Vice-Minister of National Planning and Economic Development Thuraing Zaw. Present at the signing ceremony were Chinese Minister of Foreign Affairs Li Zhaoxing and Minister of Finance Jin Renqing. China has provided preferential tariff treatment to 335 categories of goods imported from Cambodia, 239 categories of goods from Laos and 133 categories of goods from Myanmar since 1 January 2004. To promote economic

development of the three countries and boost regional prosperity, Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao announced this July that China would expand its preferential tariff treatments to the three countries. (XNA, 11 Dec 05)

After the talks between State Council Premier Wen Jiabao and Czech Prime Minister Jiri Paroubek in Prague, Wen Jiabao and Paroubek signed the Joint Statement between the Government of the PRC and the Government of the Czech Republic and attended the signing ceremony for 14 documents, including agreements on cultural, agricultural and forestry cooperation and investment protection and agreements on cooperation between enterprises in both countries. ... ## Greece (Jan 19)

... State Council Premier Wen Jiabao and Greek Prime Minister Costas Karamanlis signed the "Joint Statement of the People's Republic of China and the Republic of Greece on the Establishment of Overall Strategic Partnership" and also attended a ceremony for signing documents on cooperation between the two sides in trade, economy, culture and other areas. ... ## Guinea-Bissau (Jan 17)

China signed an agreement with Guinea-Bissau on economic and technical cooperation, news from Bissau, the African country's capital, said. The agreement was signed in Bissau by China's Ambassador to Guinea-Bissau Tian Guangfeng and the African nation's secretary of state for international cooperation, Tibna Sambe Nawana. ... Under the agreement, the Chinese government will assist the African country in several programmes, including the rebuilding of a hospital. (XNA, 18 Jan 06)

## India (Jan 12)

China and India signed a memorandum of understanding on "intensifying cooperation in the petroleum and natural gas sectors" in Beijing on 12 January. This memorandum of understanding was jointly signed by India's Petroleum and Natural Gas Minister Aiyar and China's State Development and Reform Commission Min-

ister Ma Kai. This important document is aimed at pushing the two countries to intensify the cooperation in the sphere of energy resources, ensuring the security of energy resources, and pushing the stability of Asia's energy market. ... It was reported that the China-India cooperation in the petroleum sphere also includes exploitation of crude oil, oil refining, development of ethanol gasoline, and improvement of energy efficiency. The two countries will jointly set up a work team and meet at least once a year to promote the progress of cooperation. China and India once successfully conducted cooperation in the energy sphere. In December 2005, the China National Petroleum Corporation and the Indian Oil and Natural Gas Corporation signed an agreement with the Petro-Canada to purchase the Petro-Canada's oil assets in Syria. ## Italy (Jan 20)

Chinese and Italian cultural officials signed an agreement in Beijing in order to strengthen cooperation in control of the theft and smuggling of cultural relics. At the signing ceremony, Shan Jixiang, director of the State Administration of Cultural Heritage, said: "Smuggling of cultural relics has become a world difficult problem like munitions and drug smuggling." Both China and Italy have plenty of cultural heritage resources. The agreement will help prevent illegal trade of the two countries' cultural relics and better protect the precious cultural heritage of the world, Shan said. According to the agreement, special organizations will be established by the cultural heritage departments of the two countries to take charge of the work of preventing the theft and smuggling of cultural relics. The special organizations of the two countries will exchange information on the antiques forbidden to be exported, underground relics, new archaeological discoveries and so on. The two countries will also strengthen exchanges and training of specialists in the field of safety management of cultural heritage, antiques market management, exit-entry administration of cultural relics, according to the agreement. The two sides will push forward the application of the Galileo satellite nav-

igation system, a major European project, and other advanced technologies in the prevention of theft and smuggling of cultural relics, says the agreement. Information on the two countries' stolen cultural relics, which emerge on the international cultural relics markets, will be shared by the two sides to help return the cultural relics. China has increased investment in the crackdown of cultural relics smuggling in recent years, and has actively taken part in international cooperation in this field, Shan added. (XNA, 20 Jan 06)

#### **Japan** (Dec 05)

China and Japan signed the China-Japan Long-Term Trade Agreement in Tokyo. This provided a framework for trade exchanges between the two countries between 2006 and 2010. Chen Jian, assistant to China's minister of commerce and chairman of China's China-Japan Long-Term Trade Agreement Committee, and Koga Kensuke, chairman of Japan's Japan-China Long-Term Trade Agreement Committee, signed the agreement. The core content of this long-term trade agreement is that China and Japan will further strengthen cooperation in energy conservation technologies and equipment as well as environmental protection technologies and equipment, and agreement has been reached on China's export of coal to Japan and China's import of energy conservation and environmental protection equipment and technologies from Japan. This was the sixth time a similar agreement was signed since the first China-Japan Long-Term Trade Agreement was signed in 1978. The China-Japan Long-Term Trade Agreement has played an important role in maintaining the stable and rapid development of trade exchanges between the two countries. During this period, total bilateral trade between China and Japan increased from 4.82bn US\$ to 168bn US\$ in 2004. Total trade volume is expected to see further increases this year. (Xinhua, 5 Dec 05, in BBC PF, 13 Dec 05)

#### **Jordan** (Dec 12)

... After the talks between Chinese President Hu Jintao and Jordanian King Abdallah II, who is in China for a working visit, the two heads of state attended the ceremony for the signing of documents on bilateral cooper-

#### **Lebanon** (Dec 09)

China and Lebanon signed an accord in Beirut to promote their cooperation in tourism. The accord was signed by Chinese Ambassador to Lebanon Liu Xianghua and Lebanese Tourism Minister Joseph Sarkis. According to the document, the two countries will promote communication between their tourist companies and organizations, and encourage investment in each other's tourism sector. The document requires the two countries train specialized personnel for the tourism industry, boost exchange of professional skills in the sector and encourage tourism research institutes to conduct more contacts and joint activities. The two countries are urged to provide assistance to each other in establishing official tourism offices in their territories. The two sides also agreed to set up a joint committee to coordinate the cooperation efforts. Lebanon is rich in tourism resources and the tourism sector has served as the country's pillar industry. Lebanese official statistics show that the country received about 1.3 million foreign travellers in 2004. (XNA, 10 Dec 05)

#### **Liberia** (Jan 16)

The Liberian government and the People's Republic of China have signed an agreement under which the Chinese government will provide 25m US\$ assistance towards Liberia's reconstruction programme. Under the agreement signed in Monrovia, the Chinese government is to also provide Liberia an interest free loan of 5m US\$ within a period of 10 years beginning 1 February this year. According to the agreement, the loan shall be [words indistinct] and other projects to be defined by the Liberian government. According to the agreement, the loan shall be repaid within a period of 10 years beginning 2021 [words indistinct]. Chinese Foreign Minister Li Zhaoxing signed for the People's Republic of China while Vice-President Joseph Boakai signed for the Liberian government. (Radio Veritas,

#### **Mali** (Jan 13)

Chinese Foreign Minister Li Zhaoxing and his Malian counterpart Mactar Ouane signed an agreement in Bamako on economic and technological cooperation. ... Both sides agreed to enhance cooperative ties in the following aspects: Firstly, both countries will intensify political dialogue and consultations on key issues in the United Nations and other international organizations. Secondly, to promote economic and trade cooperation. China will take further steps to encourage investments in Mali, while Mali will strive to increase the direct export of cotton and other products to China. Thirdly, both countries will actively explore ways to promote cooperation in agriculture, telecommunications services, health, culture, tourism and personnel services, giving priority to projects fundamental to Mali's economic and social development. Fourthly, both countries will continue to promote the Sino-African partnership within the framework of the China-Africa Cooperation Forum. Ouane said his country will closely cooperate with China to ensure the successful holding of the China-Africa summit in Beijing in November. ... (XNA, 14 Jan 06)

#### **Mexico** (Feb 14)

The governments of Mexico and China signed an agreement to promote the teaching of the Chinese language and culture in Mexico through a series of teaching institutions named after Chinese philosopher Confucius. Mexican Education Secretary Reyes Tamez and his Chinese counterpart Zhou Ji signed the agreement at the sidelines of the sixth meeting of the E-9 ministers of education, in the northern Mexican city of Monterrey. The four Confucius centres will be built at Mexico City's National Autonomous University, the country's largest educational institution, and the autonomous universities of Yucatan, Guadajajara and Nuevo Leon. "I hope that more Confucius institutes will be opened across the world and that at the same time people in China will study more foreign languages like Spanish," said Chinese State Councillor Chen Zhili who also attended the signing ceremony. E-9 is an ed-



educational organization of the world's most populous nations. The E-9 nations have 50 per cent of the world's school-age population, 45 per cent of the world's 100 million children who have never been educated, and around 70 per cent of the world's 771 million illiterate adults. The two-day E-9 meeting began on Monday with the aim to promote educational cooperation among nine nations: Bangladesh, Brazil, China, Egypt, India, Indonesia, Mexico, Nigeria and Pakistan. (XNA, 15 Feb 06)

#### **Mongolia** (Dec 19)

China and Mongolia signed a memorandum of understanding in Beijing to promote cooperation between procuratorate organs of the two nations. Jia Chunwang, procurator-general of China's Supreme People's Procuratorate, and Mongolian Procurator-General Mongolyn Altanhuyag signed the document. Jia hoped that based on the document, the two sides would further enhance cooperation in personnel exchanges and other fields, in an effort to contribute more to the development of China-Mongolia relations. Altanhuyag and his party attended the Asia Europe Meeting Prosecutors-General Conference in the boomtown of Shenzhen in south China's Guangdong Province from 9 to 12 December. (XNA, 19 Dec 05)

#### **Myanmar** (Feb 14)

... After the meeting between State Council Premier Wen Jiabao and Prime Minister Soe Win of Myanmar, the two prime ministers attended a signing ceremony for an agreement on economic and technical cooperation and an civilian airline flight agreement reached by the two countries. ... #### **Namibia** (Dec 19)

After the talks between Chinese President Hu Jintao and Namibian President Hifikepunye Pohamba in Beijing, Hu and Pohamba attended a ceremony of signing documents on bilateral cooperation, including an agreement on economic and technological cooperation between the governments of both countries. ... #### **Niger** (Dec 30)

China signed a pact with Niger in Lome and agreed to grant the African

country 30m RMBY (about 3.72m US\$) in aid, according to news reports from Niger's capital Niamey. The agreement was signed by Chinese Ambassador to Niger Chen Gonglai and Niger's acting Foreign Minister and Defence Minister Hassane Souley Dit Bonto. Under the agreement, the Nigerien government could spend the money on projects agreed by the two governments. At the signing ceremony, Souley said the assistance was another testimony to the friendly ties between China and Niger and the great importance attached by the Chinese leadership to the bilateral ties. China has granted several concessional and interest-free loans to Niger under the two countries' cooperation framework, said the minister. What's more, the projects constructed with the assistance of the Chinese government, such as the Zinder water supply project, the renovation of the Kountie gymnasium and stadium and a farm tool assembly plant have contributed greatly to Niger's poverty-reduction cause. The two countries also have fruitful cooperation in the fields of energy, public health, water conservancy and troops, and the bilateral cooperative relations are a great example of South-South cooperation, said the minister. He said Niger appreciates Chinese President Hu Jintao's pledge at the summit marking the 60th anniversary of the United Nations to give more assistance to African countries and strengthen cooperation with developing countries. ... (XNA, 31 Dec 05)

#### **Pakistan** (Dec 09)

China and Pakistan signed an agreement in Beijing on an "early harvest" preferential tariff programme for the Free Trade Area between the two countries. According to the agreement, 486 categories of Chinese goods exported to Pakistan will enjoy the zero-tariff treatment, relating mainly to vegetables, fruit, stone materials, textile machinery and organic chemical products. Meanwhile, China will give zero-tariff treatment to 769 categories of goods imported from Pakistan, mainly involving vegetables, fruit, stone materials, cotton fabric and man-made fabric. The two countries will start the tariff reduction process on 1 January 2006, and the tariffs are expected to reach zero by

1 January 2008. From that same date, China will also cut its tariffs by 27 per cent on 1,671 kinds of products from Pakistan, and Pakistan will cut tariff by an average range of 22 per cent on 575 kinds of products from China. The "early harvest" programme is the first step to establish the Sino-Pakistan Free Trade Area, said Chinese Minister of Commerce Bo Xilai at the signing ceremony, which was also attended by Pakistan Minister of Commerce Humayun Akhtar Khan. The negotiations on the Sino-Pakistan Free Trade Area were kicked off in April this year, when Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao visited Pakistan. (XNA, 9 Dec 05)

#### **Philippines** (Feb 10)

The Philippines and China signed an extradition treaty that will take effect on 12 March. Foreign Affairs Secretary Alberto Romulo and Chinese Ambassador Li Jinjun signed a certificate formalizing the treaty at the Department of Foreign Affairs. Romulo said the extradition treaty "reaffirms the commitment of the Philippines and China to broaden cooperation across all fronts and bolsters both governments' efforts to jointly address the challenges of an increasingly borderless region." The treaty also complements previous agreements on cooperation between the two countries' law enforcement agencies against drug trafficking and 13 other crimes. To support this network of cooperation, Manila and Beijing will soon assign police liaison officers at their respective diplomatic missions. These undertakings emphasize the centuries-old ties between the Philippines and China as well as the two countries' 30 years of formal diplomatic relations, Romulo said. "Indeed, it can well be said that the Philippines and China have now entered a golden age of partnership as envisioned both by President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo and President Hu Jintao," he said. #### **Portugal** (Dec 09)

China and Portugal signed 10 documents on bilateral cooperation covering a variety of fields. The documents were signed on the sidelines of a visit by Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao to Portugal. Wen, who was present at the signing ceremony to-

gether with his Portuguese counterpart Jose Socrates, signed one of the documents - the Joint Statement on Strengthening Bilateral Relations Between the People's Republic of China and the Republic of Portugal, which is meant to consolidate and strengthen an all-round strategic partnership between the two countries. The other documents, signed by a group of Chinese and Portuguese officials, included a judiciary cooperation agreement between the two countries, and a framework agreement on the establishment of a Konfucius institute between the education ministries of China and Portugal. ... (XNA, 9 Dec 05)

#### **Russia** (Nov 29)

The Public Security Bureau reports, the first Sino-Russian Cooperative Narcotics Control Ministerial Meeting was held in the Russian city of Khabarovsk. The deputy director of the Chinese National Narcotics Control Commission/vice-minister of public security, Zhang Xinfeng, and the vice-chairman of the Russian Federation's Narcotics Bureau, Mr Oleg Kharichkin, each led delegations to attend the meeting. Both sides signed the "People's Republic of China Public Security Bureau and Russian Federation Narcotics Bureau Cooperative Agreement on Border-Region Narcotics Control." According to the regulations put forth in the agreement, China's Heilongjiang, Jilin, Xinjiang, and Inner Mongolian border-region provinces Public Security Narcotics Control Departments are permitted, within authorized parameters, to directly exchange information and cooperate with the Russian Far East and Siberian Federated Region's border-region drug enforcement agencies, so as to collectively attack international illicit drug activities. Both sides exchanged views on the daily worsening narcotics situation in the "Golden Crescent" region and emphasized both countries' cooperation. They unanimously expressed that as member-states in the Shanghai Cooperative Organization both sides should continue to positively carry out the "Agreement of Shanghai Cooperative Organization Member-States Regarding the War on Illegal Narcotics Shipment, Psychoactive Drugs and its Precursor" signed by the heads of each member-state in 2004. Each side

should push for a collective solution to the Afghanistan drug problem. In addition, the Chinese also made a statement on the basic state of the Peoples' War on Drugs and its results since inception. Both sides agreed to meet in China in 2006 for a second Sino-Russian Cooperative Narcotics Control Ministerial Meeting. (Xinhua, 8 Dec 05, in BBC PF, 10 Dec 05)

#### **Rwanda** (Dec 10)

The Rwandan and Chinese governments have signed a cooperation agreement and a grant [agreement] in a bid to promote the long-lasting relations between both countries. The grant, worth 30m Rwandan francs, as well as a loan worth 1.5m dollars that is expected to be paid in an estimated period of 30 years, will fund the construction of the president's office, that is the State House. The cooperation agreement was signed on behalf of the Rwandan government by the foreign affairs and cooperation minister, Dr Charles Muligande, and the Chinese Ambassador Qi Deen. #### **Saudi Arabia** (Jan 23)

... After the talks between Chinese President Hu Jintao and King Abdallah bin-Abd-al-Aziz, the two heads of state attended a ceremony for the signing of a protocol between the two governments on cooperation in petroleum, natural gas and minerals, the minutes of the Third China-Saudi Arabia Mixed Committee on Economic, Trade, Investment and Technological Cooperation, as well as a China-Saudi Arabia agreement on cooperation in the training of professionals, and other cooperative documents. ... #### **Slovakia** (Dec 07)

China and Slovakia signed agreements on investment protection and communications cooperation. Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao and his Slovak counterpart, Mikulas Dzurinda, witnessed the signing ceremony in Bratislava. The two documents are an additional protocol to an agreement on the encouragement and mutual protection of investment, and an agreement between China's Information Industry Ministry and Slovakia's Ministry of Transport, Post and Telecommunica-

tions in communications cooperation. (XNA, 7 Dec 05)

#### **Somalia** (Dec 26)

Chinese Ambassador to Kenya Guo Chongli, on behalf of the Chinese government in Jowhar signed several agreements with Somali President Abdullahi Yusuf Ahmad, providing over 6m US\$ economic aid to Somalia. According to the agreements, the Chinese government will provide a grant of 50m RMBY (about 6.3m US\$) to the Somali government, and the grant shall be utilized to finance provision of goods or projects to be agreed upon through consultations between the governments of the two countries. ... the Chinese government has also granted 100,000 US\$ in cash to the Somali government. Another accord is about the grant from the China Charity Federation, which donated 250,000 US\$ to demonstrate the sympathy and support of the Chinese people to the Somali people on the great loss suffered from the tsunami disaster. ... #### **Togo** (Feb 13)

Chinese president Hu Jintao and his Togolese counterpart Faure Essozimna Gnassingbe ... attended a signing ceremony for the economic and technological cooperation agreements between China and Togo. (XNA, 13 Feb 06)

#### **Zambia** (Dec 20)

... After the talks between Chinese Vice-President Zeng Qinghong and Augustine Lupando Mwape, vice-president of the Republic of Zambia, the two countries signed several cooperative documents. ... (XNA, 20 Dec 05)

### **International Agreements**

The head of China's state quality watchdog and the EU commissioner for health and consumer protection signed an MoU (Memorandum of Understanding) in Beijing on 16 January to promote safer bilateral trade in consumer and industrial products. Li Changjiang, director of the General Administration of Quality Supervision, Inspection and Quarantine, and Markos Kyprianou, EU health and consumer protection commissioner, attended the signing ceremony. The MoU will help solve dis-

putes arising from bilateral trade, including those on product standards, certification and risk evaluation, said Li. It includes specific items on how to exchange information, set up a joint workforce and provide quick responses. Before the signing ceremony, the two officials held talks on China's poultry exports to European countries, and European meat, fruit and cosmetics exports to China. (XNA, 16 Jan 06)

#### **Macau SAR Agreement with the Hong Kong SAR (Dec 13)**

The validity of Macau residents' Travel Passes to Hong Kong will be extended from three to seven years. The Executive Council passed the amendment bill on the regulations concerning the Passes, after complaints were received over frequent renewals. Discussions had been taken place with Hong Kong's Immigration Department over the issue, and both sides agreed the extension of the validity of the Travel Passes from three to seven years, and the total number of pages increased from 32 to 48. Meanwhile, the application fee of a Travel Pass will also increase from 80 to 100 Patacas. ## PRC Laws and Regulations

**Law of the People's Republic of China on Animal Husbandry**, adopted at the 19th meeting of the 10th NPC Standing Committee on 29 December. This law will come in effect as of 1 July 2006 (Presidential Decree No. 45, signed by State President Hu Jintao on 29 December 2005) (Full text: RMRB, 7 Jan 06) This law consists of eight chapters with 74 articles. The NPC Standing Committee passed the draft of Law on Animal Husbandry on 29 December, laying down the legal foundation to ensure sound breeding conditions of livestock and livestock product quality. The eight-chapter law includes regulations on livestock generic substance protection, livestock breed selection, raising and production, transportation and product quality protection. The passed draft added one article from the previous version, requiring government departments to guide people in the animal husbandry business to improve conditions of breeding and transportation. The term of "animal welfare" was deleted in former deliberation as it is too abstract to define, said legislators. According to the new law, the use of feedstuff, feedstuff additive and medicines should follow legal and technical standards and hogwash of restaurants without being boiled in high temperature and trash should not be used to raise livestock. NPC Vice-Chairman Lu Yongxiang said the new law will help facilitate the modernization of the animal husbandry industry as it will focus more on improving product quality rather than expanding capacity. Laws related to animal husbandry such as Grassland Law and Law on Animal Epidemic Prevention adopted before only involve certain aspects of the industry and fail to regulate the entire process

of industry production and development. With the fact that many farmers raise their livestock in their households, the new law stimulates that governments above the county level should take measures to enhance infrastructure construction and build up an animal husbandry of big scale. Animal husbandry has become a pillar industry of China's rural economy. Its output value reached 1217.3bn RMBY (152.1bn US\$) in 2004, accounting for 33.6 per cent of the total agricultural output value. (XNA, 29 Dec 05)

**The Decision of the State Council Regarding Amendments to the "Details for Implementing the Statistics Law of the People's Republic of China"** is hereby promulgated and will come into force from 1 February 2006. (State Council Decree No 453 of the People's Republic of China, signed by Premier Wen Jiabao on 16 Dec 2005) (Full text of the decision: RMRB, 11 Jan 06) Text of "(Authorized release) State Council decision on revising the 'Implementing Regulations for Statistics Law of the People's Republic of China'", carried by official Chinese news agency Xinhua (New China News Agency) Beijing, 2 January: Decision of the State Council on the Revision of the "Implementing Regulations for Statistics Law of the People's Republic of China" The State Council has decided to make the following revisions for the "Implementing Regulations for Statistics Law of the People's Republic of China": 1. Article 6 will be revised as follows: "The National Bureau of Statistics, investigation teams dispatched to various places by the National Bureau of Statistics, and statistical organizations of people's government at or above the country level are the units to implement statistical law, regulations and system, and are responsible for supervising and inspecting the implementation of statistical law, regulations and system, carry out functions and power of statistical organizations and personnel, and investigate and handle activities in violation of statistical law, regulations and system." Section Two will be added to Article 6 as follows: "Statistical organizations of people's governments at or above the county level are to investigate and handle activities in violation of statistical law, regulations and system within the jurisdiction of their respective administrative area according to the law. Activities in violation of statistical law, regulations and system discovered by investigation teams dispatched by the National Bureau of Statistics will be investigated and handled by the investigation teams dispatched by the National Bureau of Statistics." 2. Article 21 will be revised as follows: "The state will establish a sound system for the supervision and evaluation of the quality of statistical data, and strengthen the supervision and evaluation of important

statistical data of various provinces, autonomous regions, and municipalities under the jurisdiction of the central authorities.“ 3. Paragraph (3) of Section One of Article 22 will be revised as follows: “Under the leadership of the State Council, the National Bureau of Statistics will work together with concerned departments to organize important general survey of national situation and national strength, and will organize sampling survey of national social and economic situation in coordination with concerned departments. Paragraph (7) of [Section One of Article 22] will be revised as “The National Bureau of Statistics will exercise unified leadership and administrative over investigation teams dispatched to various places by the bureau.“Section Two will be added to Article 22 as follows: “Investigation teams dispatched by the National Bureau of Statistics will assume various investigation tasks assigned by the National Bureau of Statistics, and carry out independent statistical investigation according to the law and directly submit statistical data to the National Bureau of Statistics.“4. Paragraph (6) under Section One of Article 23 shall be eliminated, 5. Paragraph (2) under Section One of Article 26 will be revised as follows: “It is necessary to report and provide statistical data according to related state regulations, and conduct statistical analysis and exercise supervision of the implementation of plans and operation and management of its own unit.“6. Section One of Article 33 will be revised as “When enterprises or undertakings violate Section One of Article 27, they shall be given warnings by statistical organizations of people’s government at or above the country level or investigation teams dispatched by the National Bureau of Statistics, and may be fined for 50,000 yuan [renmibi] or less.“Section Two [of Article 33] will be revised as “When individual business concerns violate Section One of Article 27, they shall be given warnings by statistical organizations of people’s government at or above the country level or investigation teams dispatched by the National Bureau of Statistics, and may be fined for 10,000 yuan [renmibi] or less.“This decision will be put into force on 1 February 2006. The “Implementing Regulations for Statistics Law of the People’s Republic of

China“will be revised according to this decision and be republished. (Xinhua, 2 Jan 06, in BBC PF, 7 Feb 06) **Details for Implementing the Statistics Law of the People’s Republic of China** (adopted by the State Council on 19 January 1987, issued by the National Bureau of Statistics on 15 February 1987, adopted and revised by the State Council on 2 June 2000, issued by the National Bureau of Statistics on 15 June 2000, and revised according to the “Decision of the State Council Regarding Amendments to the ‘Details for Implementing the Statistics Law of the PRC““on 16 December 2005) The details consist of six chapters with 36 articles. (Full text: RMRB, 11 Jan 06)

The **Customs Statistics Regulations of the People’s Republic of China** are hereby promulgated and will come into force from 1 March 2006. (State Council Decree No 454 of the People’s Republic of China, signed by Premier Wen Jiabao on 25 Dec 2005) These regulations consist of 22 articles. (Full text: RMRB, 24 Jan 06)

The **Regulations on the Safe Management of Fireworks**, approved by the State Council at its 121st executive meeting on 11 January 2006, are hereby promulgated for enforcement. The regulations take effect on the day of promulgation. (State Council Decree No 455 of the People’s Republic of China, signed by Premier Wen Jiabao on 21 January 2006) The regulations consist of seven chapters with 46 articles. (Full text: RMRB, 26 Jan 06) The recent regulation of the State Council on the production, transport and sale of pyrotechnics institutes severe penalties for illegal activities. According to the latest regulation, fireworks factories must have a production permit and strictly implement national industrial standards. All factory workers should receive job training provided by their employers. The regulation also sets specific rules for the transport of fireworks, including vehicle speed limits and passenger bans. The regulation says nobody should be allowed to take public transport with fireworks or mail fireworks through public networks. Illegal manufacturers will face penalties ranging from 20,000 to 100,000 RMBY (about 2,500 to 12,500 US\$), illegal

transporters 10,000 to 50,000 RMBY and individuals who try to mail fireworks will be fined from 200 to 1,000 RMBY. China has a long history of making fireworks and fireworks displays. However, many of its fireworks factories are still primitive with poor production conditions. Statistics released by the State Administration of Work Safety show that from January to November 2005, there were 87 accidents in pyrotechnics factories, claiming 187 lives. (XNA, 25 Jan 06)

The **Regulations on the Work of Supporting Five-Guarantee Households in Rural Areas**, approved by the State Council at its 121st executive meeting on 11 January 2006, are hereby promulgated for enforcement beginning on 1 March 2006. [“Five-guarantee households“refers to households of childless and infirm old people who are provided with food, clothing, medical care, housing, and burial expenses.] (State Council Decree No 456 of the People’s Republic of China, signed by Premier Wen Jiabao on 21 January 2006) (Xinhua, 26 Jan 06, in BBC PF, 27 Jan 06; full text: RMRB, 27 Jan 06) The regulations consist of seven chapters with 26 articles. The State Council published on 26 January regulations on guarantee for the living of rural seniors or disadvantaged. Rural seniors and disadvantaged people who are not able to earn a living and have no supports from their family members should be given care and help in food, clothing, housing, medical service and burial, according to the regulations. Rural disadvantaged minors under or above 16 years old should be secured with the money for a compulsory education, it said. “The fund for supporting the helpless should be arranged from local government budgets or revenues of rural collectives,“said the regulations, which will be effective on 1 March 2006. The central government will also set aside money for the helpless where the local governments face financial difficulties. Service centres and facilities for the helpless should be taken into account when local governments work out their social and economic development programmes and all the staff working with the supporting centres should be well-trained, according to the regulation. (XNA, 26 Jan 06)

**Statute for the Prevention and Control of AIDS**, adopted at the 122nd executive meeting of the State Council on 18 January 2006. The statute will go into effect on 1 March 2006. (State Council Decree No 457 of the People's Republic of China, signed by Premier Wen Jiabao on 29 January 2006) (XNA, 12 Feb 06) The Chinese State Council issued a statute on the prevention and control of AIDS on 12 February, stipulating relevant duties of all-level governments and defining the rights and obligations of the HIV carriers and AIDS patients. The statute falls into seven chapters, including general rules, publicity and education, prevention and control, cure and relief, guarantee measures, legal responsibilities and supplementary articles. Governments above the county-level must provide free anti-HIV/AIDS drugs for rural AIDS patients and underprivileged urban patients, and offer free treatments and consultations on prevention of the mother-baby infection to pregnant and lying-in women, the statute says. HIV carriers and AIDS patients must take measures to prevent infecting other people and must not spread AIDS deliberately by any means, according to the statute, which was approved by the State Council on 18 January and will work as of 1 March. (XNA, 12 Feb 06)

On 9 February the Personnel Ministry enacted **Provisional Rules on Open Recruitment of Personnel of Public Institutions** (from here on referred to as "Provisional Rules"). Under the "Provisional Rules, from this year onward, all new personnel of public institutions, except those subject to the state's policy-purpose placement, superior-level appointments according to rules on cadre-personnel administration competence and other selection and appointment methods for confidentiality-involved posts, shall be recruited openly. According to the "Provisional Rules", in recruiting personnel, public institutions shall publicly release recruitment information to society. Everyone with the nationality of the People's Republic of China, the conduct of observing the constitution and laws, moral integrity, the post-required specialization and skills, the post-required physical con-

ditions and other post-required qualifications may apply. The "Provisional Rules" are applicable to public institutions' recruitment of specialized and technical personnel, management personnel, and service personnel, except those governed by the civil service system or in public institutions which have been transformed into enterprises. The "Provisional Rules" have established the principles of openness, equality, competition and merit and, at same time, stipulate that the personnel administration department of a government shall be in charge of work of open recruitment by public institutions under the said government and is responsible for guiding, supervising and administering public institutions' work of open recruitment. Open recruitment shall be conducted by employer units through the use of the examination and evaluation method in view of employment qualifications and requirements for the posts for recruitment. Examinations are organized by public institutions themselves, and may also be organized in a unified way by government personnel administration departments or superior-level departments in charge of public institutions. According to the "Provisional Rules", contents of examinations shall be on specialized knowledge, professional competence and work skills necessary for the posts for recruitment. The topics and methods of examinations shall be determined on the basis of the lines of work, fields of specialization and characteristics of the posts involved. Those applying for service personnel posts may be subjected to actual operating ability tests conducted on the basis of key requirements. Urgently needed high-level personnel in shortage-beset fields of specialization and personnel for high-level professional or technical positions or with doctoral degrees may be recruited through direct evaluations. To recruit foreign nationals, a public institution needs to obtain approval from the personnel administration department of a government at or above the provincial level, and such recruitment shall be governed by the relevant rules of the state. The "Provisional Rules" also contain stipulations on systems of public releasing of recruitment plans and information, qualification examination, filling and refusal. Personnel adminis-

tration departments of governments of provinces, autonomous regions and municipalities directly under the central government may formulate local open recruitment procedures in accordance with the "Provisional Rules". According to a relevant responsible person of the Personnel Ministry, the system of open recruitment of public institutions emphasizes openness, that is, open recruitment information, open procedures and open results; emphasizes open recruitment conducted on the basis of employment qualifications and requirements for posts; and emphasizes uniform standards, category-based guidance and multi-level management conducted in accordance with the principle of combining macro-level government management with employer units' personnel employment autonomy, making clear issues of competence, procedures and specific methods with regard to recruitment. (Xinhua, 9 Feb 06, in BBC PF, 13 Feb 06)

By approval of Chairman Hu Jintao, the Central Military Commission recently promulgated **Regulations on the Work of CCP Branches in Armed Forces**. This is the first specialized code that systematically governs the work of party branches in our army. It is yet another major achievement in the institutional building of the party in our Army, following the revision of the "Regulations on Political Work" and the formulation of the "Regulations on the Work of Party Committees". It is a major initiative for strengthening the building of the advanced nature of grassroots party organizations by adapting to the development and changes of the circumstances and tasks. It is a practical step in improving the work of grassroots party organizations to make it more scientific, institutionalized, and regularized. ... The Regulations are in eight chapters and 68 articles, covering all the essential aspects of party branch building and work in the army. ... (Xinhua, 11 Dec 05, in BBC PF, 12 Dec 05; RMRB, 12 Dec 05)

In addition to central and provincial-level government bodies and legislatures, all Chinese organizations and individuals have been granted the right to question any law or regulation that they believe may contradict the constitution and state

laws. This provision is contained in a **newly-amended procedural law on the examination and approval of administrative, local and provincial-level laws and regulations**. The law was approved on 19 December, at the 40th meeting of the chairperson and vice-chairpersons of the NPC Standing Committee. The aim of the new procedural regulation is to preserve the integrity of the country's legal system, by further improving mechanisms for checking and approving laws, regulations and legal opinions. The correction of a law or regulation that is thought to be in contradiction with the constitution and state laws involves two or three steps: 1. consultation with the lawmaker; 2. an application is sent to the relevant committee requesting correction; 3. if the law-making institution declines to make the correction, the matter can be submitted to the NPC Standing Committee for a final decision. The meeting also approved a procedural regulation concerning the procedure for examining and approving judicial opinions. (XNA, 19 Dec 05)

China's Ministry of Public Security (MPS) announced on 29 December that China is to carry out **new Internet regulation** starting from 1 March 2006, to prevent computer virus spreading, harmful junk e-mails and organized bawdry online activities. The regulation specifies that Internet service providers are liable to safeguard the Internet security and the police should supervise all providers. A series of Internet-based technologies including monitoring computer systems and recording such information as the logon time and the browsed websites are standardized according to the regulation. The regulation also states that any online safeguarding technique should not be used to infringe upon the individuals' freedom and privacy and at least two members of the police should be at scene when inspecting suspects. China's Internet-based safeguarding technologies is somewhat backward and are not implemented properly, with no more than 25 per cent of the existing safeguarding methods applied by Internet users, said Wu Heping, spokesman with the MPS, at a news briefing on a nationwide campaign of cracking down on-line porn.

Online obscene video chats, gambling and frauds have become serious crimes in recent years and are still rising, said Wu. From September to November, Chinese public security authorities shut down 598 porn websites and wiped out 35 porn domain names, and all the discovered porn websites in China have been closed as of today, according to Wu. More than 80 per cent of the domestic computers were once infected by virus annually in recent years and the daily junk mails flowing to domestic users exceeds 60 million, making China a giant country of sending and receiving junk mails, he said. Currently, China's Internet users numbers more than 100 million, ranking the second globally. Internet is one of the important parts of Chinese people's life but porn online contents, junk mails and the spread of computer virus have seriously damaged Internet users' legitimate rights. Together with the Information Office of the State Council and the Ministry of Information Industry, MPS launched a nationwide campaign on cracking down Internet porn like on-line video chatting in September this year. One MPS official said the public are encouraged to report any online activity violating laws or code of conducts through phones or an official websites [net.china.cn](http://net.china.cn). (XNA, 29 Dec 05)
