The bilateral MoU is also part of activities marking the "India-China Friendship Year 2006". ... Indo-Chinese cooperation in the science and technology field is presently being implemented under an inter-governmental S&T Agreement signed between the two countries in Beijing during the visit of late Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi in 1988. Hong Kong SAR Agreement with the Mainland (Aug 21)

Beijing and Hong Kong sealed an agreement on avoidance of double taxation (RMRB, 22 Aug 06), which is expected to reduce the tax burden of Hong Kong companies doing business and investing on the mainland. Officials also said the agreement would put Hong Kong ahead of Macau and Singapore in terms of the low tax rate applied under the scheme. Under the agreement, Beijing agreed to allocate the right to tax Hong Kong residents or businesses over the transfer of shares in mainland enterprises "exclusively to Hong Kong". The agreement is entitled the Arrangement for the Avoidance of Double Taxation on Income and Prevention of Fiscal Evasion. Hong Kong investors who sell less than 25 per cent of a stake in a mainland company - whose assets do not comprise mainly immovable property - will also be exempted from paying a 10 per cent tax on the proceeds to the mainland under the new policy because the tax right of the income, previously enjoyed by both jurisdictions, has been awarded exclusively to Hong Kong. The agreement will also clarify certain tax rights of the two jurisdictions to avoid double taxation of the same income. Before the agreement, a Hong Kong resident or company were required to pay up to 20 per cent and 10 per cent withholding tax respectively for dividends, interest and royalties gained from mainland investments. Under the new pact, the top rates are reduced to a range of 5 to 10 per cent, lower than the 7 to 12 per cent adopted by Macau and Singapore. Speaking at the signing ceremony yesterday, Chief Executive Donald Tsang Yam-kuen said: "A comprehensive double taxation arrangement with the mainland, together with CEPA [the Closer Economic Partnership Arrangement], will provide added incentives for international investors to enter the mainland market through Hong Kong." Yesterday, officials could not provide an estimate on tax savings for Hong Kong investors and businesses under the deal. Last year, total Hong Kong investment on the mainland amounted to

US\$259.5 billion, of which 60 per cent, or US\$155.7 billion, was concentrated on the 130,000 Hong Kong enterprises in the Pan Pearl River Delta Region. Commissioner of Inland Revenue Alice Lau Mak Yee-ming said even if the government did suffer tax losses, those losses were rightly incurred. Tax partner of PricewaterhouseCoopers, Guy Ellis, said the articles dealing with indirect income and capital gains were particularly beneficial to the business community. IFPI Hong Kong Group chief executive Ricky Fung Tim-chee believed the pact would attract more foreign record companies wanting a share of the mainland market to set up their businesses in Hong Kong. The new arrangement is subjected to approval by the Legislative Council and Executive Council. (SCMP, 22 Aug 06)

PRC Laws and Regulations

Beijing, 30 August: A series of new laws and regulations, ranging from compulsory education to wildlife protection which will impact the daily life of people and the interests of the country, come into effect in China on Friday, 1 September. The new regulations include: - Free compulsory education ensured "Equal compulsory education for children in cities and the countryside" was for the first time written into the newly-revised Compulsory Education Law. The revised law aims to give children in both cities and the countryside nine years of free compulsory education. The costs will be jointly covered by the central and local governments which are required to put the expenditure into their budgets. - Reservoir compensation funds guaranteed The State Council's Subsidy Policies for People Who Were Relocated to Make Way for Dams and Reservoirs becomes effective on September 1. The central government will spend more than 13bn yuan (1.63bn US dollars) every year subsidizing 22 million people who were moved to make room for water reservoirs created by dams. The money will be raised by increasing power bills by 0.62 cents per kilowatt hour. China has built more than 3,000 large and medium-sized dams since 1949 for flood control, electricity generation, irrigation and water supply. - Controls on explosives tightened China issued stricter new controls and regulations on the civilian use and storage of explosives after a series of accidental explosions in recent years. The government will also establish a database to monitor all transactions and transport of explosives. All manufacturers, vendors and users are to establish a registration system that ensures the quantities, type and the destination

of explosives are entered into the government's database. - Import, export of endangered species banned China has banned the import and export of endangered species of wild fauna and flora. The regulation will protect and regulate the trade of wild animals and vegetation, and comply with the Convention on International Trade on Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora. - Protection of mapping data The Mapping Management Regulation states that important mapping data must only be released by the government. - Prohibition of fraud in financial aid to foreign countries The Ministry of Commerce's "Foreign Aid Guidebook" attempts to remove corruption from the management of relief materials and financial aid destined for foreign countries. No department or agency will be allowed to seek illegitimate gains through collusion with bidding companies, it said. The ministry will evaluate each foreign aid project and penalize those who violate the regulation. The penalty includes fines of 30,000 yuan (3,750 US dollars). (XNA, 30 Aug 06)

Beijing, 31 August: The amended Compulsory Education Law, which comes into effect in China on 1 September contains a new provision that ensures the right to education for children of migrant workers no matter where they live. The provision stipulates that when both parents or legal guardians are migrant workers living and working with their children in locations other than where the family is registered, local governments where they live and work must provide for the child's education. By the end of 2004, more than 6.4 million rural children of compulsory education age were living in cities with their parents. Another 22 million rural children remain in their family's rural homes, while their parents worked in cities, according to the Ministry of Education. Children who were brought to cities by their migrant parents are often charged school fees that are much higher than those charged by schools in rural areas. Yet the likelihood that these children will move often makes it difficult for some cities to meet the demand. Numerous private schools for migrant children have been established to migrant children in cities and they have been constantly attacked for

being ill-equipped, lacking infrastructure and qualified teachers to guarantee quality of education. The Compulsory Education Law was promulgated in 1986 and the revised Compulsory Education Law aims to give children in both cities and the countryside nine years of free compulsory education. The **Regulations Governing Compensations for Land Requisition and Relocation of People in the Construction of Large and Medium-Size Water Conservancy and Hydropower Projects**, approved by the 130th Executive Meeting of the State Council on 29 March 2006, is hereby promulgated and will be put into effect on 1 September 2006. (Decree No.471 of the PRC State Council, signed by Wen Jiabao, Premier of the State Council, on 7 July 2006) The regulations consist of eight chapters with 63 articles. (Xinhua, 12 Aug 06, in BBC PF, 13 Aug 06; full text: RMRB, 13 Aug 06) The State Council's Subsidy Policies for People Who Were Relocated to Make Way for Dams and Reservoirs becomes effective on September 1. The central government will spend more than 13bn yuan (1.63bn US\$) every year subsidizing 22 million people who were moved to make room for water reservoirs created by dams. The money will be raised by increasing power bills by 0.62 cents per kilowatt hour. China has built more than 3,000 large and medium-sized dams since 1949 for flood control, electricity generation, irrigation and water supply. (XNA, 30 Aug 06) Beijing, 12 August: China has issued a new regulation on compensation and resettlement for farmers whose land is acquired to build large and medium-sized water control and hydropower projects. The regulation said that the compensation should be 16 times the average yearly output value of the land being acquired, and allow the farmers to maintain their living standards. Compensation for trees, farming facilities and other personal assets on the land should be paid directly and in full by the local county-level governments to farmers, said the regulation. Farmers being required to leave the land can build their new houses based on their own needs, said the regulation. Local governments are

not allowed to set up compulsory standards for new houses. (XNA, 12 Aug 06)

Beijing, 30 August: China's first regulation on the trade of endangered wild fauna and flora comes into effect on 1 September, and Chinese officials say it will be strictly enforced. The rules cover wildlife listed by the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES). China joined the international convention in 1980. Chen Jianwei, deputy director of the Office of State Endangered Species Trade Management, said the rules forbid trading of wildlife and related products that are banned by the convention. Under the rules, approval from the Chinese government is required for export and import wildlife or wildlife products for non-commercial purposes, such as scientific research, breeding, or exchanges. Zhang Jianlong, deputy director of the State Forestry Administration, said the rules, known as the Regulations on Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora, will play an important role in protecting endangered species, safeguarding the ecology and help sustain the species. Fan Xiaojian, deputy minister of agriculture, said the rules will safeguard grain and biological safety and promote sustainable development of agriculture and rural economy. China's rich bio-diversity boasts nearly 20,000 aquatic animals and about 600 aquatic plants, and its grassland is home to about 7,000 wild plants and 10,000 animals. The country's wildlife resources are facing unprecedented threats from fast economic and social development, said the vice-minister. Frequent international exchanges and a rapid increase of international trade in wildlife may drain biological resources and lead to an invasion of foreign species, he warned. He said the Ministry of Agriculture, which is in charge of management of aquatic animals and plants, will enforce the regulations. Willem Wijnstekers, secretary-general of CITES, welcomes the new regulations as it signals new progress China has made in complying with the convention. The regulations stipulate government departments at both central and local levels must crack down on illegal trade of the wildlife, such as the pelts of large cats and ivory, said

the secretary-general. (XNA, 30 Aug 06)

Law on supervision of standing committees of people's congresses at various levels, adopted at the 23rd session of the Standing Committee of the 10th NPC on 27 Aug 06. The law will go into effect on 1 January 2007. (Presidential Decree No. 53, signed by State President Hu Jintao on 27 August 2006) The law consists of nine chapters with 48 articles. (Full text: RMRB, 29 Aug 06)

Corporate Bankruptcy Law, adopted at the 23rd session of the Standing Committee of the 10th NPC on 27 Aug 06. (Presidential Decree No. 54, signed by State President Hu Jintao on 27 August 2006) China's top legislature, the Standing Committee of the National People's Congress, on 27 August adopted a corporate bankruptcy law, aiming to protect both creditors of bankrupt enterprises and the people who work in them. The law will come into effect on 1 June, 2007. The current enterprise bankruptcy law will be abolished at the same time. The current bankruptcy rules, promulgated in 1986 on a test basis, are widely regarded as outdated as they fail to give sufficient protection to creditors and only touch on State-owned enterprises (SOE). The rules allow laid-off workers to be paid before creditors. The new corporate bankruptcy law will apply to all kinds of enterprises and financial institutions. All the country's companies and enterprises, whether state owned or private, will have to follow a unified corporate bankruptcy law if they founder. The new law stipulates that from 1 June, 2007, all insolvent enterprises will pay credit guarantees to creditors first, and use other assets not earmarked as credit guarantees to pay laid-off workers. "The provision is a compromise that aims to protect both creditors and workers of insol-

vent enterprises," said Cheng Siwei, vice-chairman of the NPC Standing Committee. "The new law embodies the notion of putting people first, as it fully considers worker's interests. At the same time it accords with standard international practice in better protecting lenders' interests," said Jia Zhijie, member of the NPC Standing Committee. Wang Xin, a law professor at Renmin University said paying creditors first in insolvency cases is common practice in market economies and will help boost foreign investors' confidence in investing in China. The new law makes an exception for around 2,000 SOEs. The State Council stipulated that SOEs that announce bankruptcy before June 2007 can be closed down with the aid of government bailouts and could pay laid-off workers first. >From 1994 to 2005, China allowed 3,658 moribund state enterprises to close with government subsidy support. In 2006, the central government set aside 33.8bn yuan to help bankrupt SOEs settle with laid-off workers. Experts called for the establishment of an effective social insurance and wage payment system that would eradicate the phenomenon of workers remaining unpaid when a company goes bankrupt. The new law also provides a bankruptcy restructuring system complete with liquidators, as well as rules on the prevention of cheating during the bankruptcy process. The new law stipulated that financial supervision institutions could apply for bankruptcy for financial institutions. To make special regulation on the bankruptcy of financial institutions in China's Corporate Bankruptcy Law marks that China began to standardize the bankruptcy of financial institutions on the legal level, said experts in law. According to the law, China's financial supervision institution under the State Council could apply to the people's courts for reshuffle and bankruptcy of financial institutions including commercial banks, insurance and securities companies when they cannot pay off debts due or meet solvency. The corporate bankruptcy law will also apply to foreign companies. The new law will also allow companies that are doing poorly to apply for reorganization. "This law will help redeem those organizations or enterprises which are in financial

difficulties and still can be revived by reorganization," said An Jian, deputy director of the Standing Committee's Legislative Affairs Commission. (XNA, 27 Aug 06; SCMP, 28 Aug 06)

Partnership Law of the People's Republic of China, adopted at the 23rd session of the Standing Committee of the 10th NPC on 27 Aug 06. The law will go into effect on 1 June 2007. (Presidential Decree No. 55, signed by State President Hu Jintao on 27 August 2006) The law consists of six chapters with 109 articles. (Full text: RMRB, 30 Aug 06) The 23rd Session of the 10th NPC Standing Committee voted and approved the revised Partnership Law of the People's Republic of China on 27 August. President Hu Jintao signed the Presidential Decree No55 to promulgate it and Xinhua News Agency has been authorized to release the full text of this law. The partnership law is divided into six chapters - general principles, ordinary partnerships, limited partnerships, dissolution and liquidation of partnerships, legal liabilities, and supplementary articles - and has a total of 109 articles, and will come into force on 1 June 2007. The law stipulates that partnership is taken as ordinary partnership and limited partnership. Ordinary partnership is made up of ordinary partners and the ordinary partners assume unlimited joint liabilities in the debts of the partnership; and limited partnership is made up of ordinary partners and limited partners, in which the ordinary partners assume unlimited joint liabilities in the debts of the partnership while the liabilities borne by the limited partners in the debts of the partnership are limited to the amount of capital put up by them. The law also stipulates that exclusively state-owned companies, state-owned enterprises, and listed companies, as well as public-service institutions and social organizations, are not allowed to become ordinary partners. The law clearly provides that the partnership agreement be concluded in written form after consultation with and the consensus of all the partners. Conclusion of the partnership agreement and establishment of the partnership ought to abide by the principle of voluntary participation, equality, impartiality, and integrity. With

respect to production and operation incomes, as well as other incomes, of the partnership, the respective partners shall pay the income tax in accordance with the relevant tax regulations of the state. (Xinhua, 27 Aug 05, in BBC PF, 30 Aug 06)

Measures for Administering the Release of News and Information in China by Foreign News Agencies. (Full text: RMRB, 11 Sep 06)

The following is the full text of "Measures for Administering the Release of News and Information in China by Foreign News Agencies" issued by Xinhua News Agency on 10th September. Measures for administering the release of news and information in China by foreign news agencies Article 1. These Measures are formulated in accordance with national laws, administrative regulations and the relevant regulations of the State Council to regulate the release of news and information in China by foreign news agencies and the subscription of such news and information by users in China and to promote the dissemination of news and information in a sound and orderly manner. Article 2. These Measures shall be applicable to the release of news and information in text, photo, graphics and other forms in China by foreign news agencies. For the purposes of these Measures, foreign news agencies include other foreign entities of the nature of a news agency that release news and information products. Article 3. Xinhua News Agency exercises unified administration over the release of news and information in China by foreign news agencies. Article 4. According to the Decision of the State Council on Establishment of Administrative Licenses for Items Subject to Administrative Examination and Approval That Need to Be Retained, for releasing their news and information in China, foreign news agencies shall be subject to approval by Xinhua News Agency and shall have entities designated by Xinhua News Agency act as their agents (hereinafter referred to as designated entities). Foreign news agencies shall not directly solicit subscription of their news and information services in China. Except the designated entities, no unit or individual shall distribute news and information of foreign news agencies or

act as their agents. Article 5. To apply for releasing news and information in China, a foreign news agency shall meet the following requirements: (1) being legally qualified in its home country or region; (2) enjoying good credit in the field of news and information release; (3) having an explicit scope of business; (4) possessing the technological and transmitting means commensurate with its business; and (5) other requirements as prescribed by Chinese laws and administrative regulations. Article 6. For releasing news and information in China, a foreign news agency shall submit a written application and the following materials to Xinhua News Agency: (1) legal credentials issued by the competent authorities of its home country or region; (2) its records of good credit issued by the relevant organization of its home country or region; (3) a detailed list, explanation and samples of the news and information release; (4) an illustration of its transmitting means; and (5) other materials as specified by Xinhua News Agency. Article 7. An entity to be designated as an agent of a foreign news agency for the distribution of news and information in China shall meet the following requirements and submit a written application to Xinhua News Agency: (1) being legally qualified; (2) enjoying good credit in acting as an agent for news and information distribution; (3) possessing the service network and transmitting means commensurate with its business; and (4) other requirements as prescribed by Chinese laws and administrative regulations and rules of government departments. Article 8. Xinhua News Agency shall, within 20 days from the date it receives the written application of a foreign news agency or designated entity, make a decision on whether to grant or not to grant the application. If it decides to grant the application, it shall issue the document of approval; otherwise, it shall notify the applicant of the decision in writing and explain the reasons why. Article 9. Before releasing news and information in China in accordance with the scope of business approved in the approval document, a foreign news agency shall sign an agency agreement with the designated entity, and within 15 days from the date of the agreement is signed, submit the agreement to Xinhua News

Agency for the record. Article 10. Before altering its scope of business, transmitting means, etc., a foreign news agency shall apply anew to Xinhua News Agency for an approval document. Article 11. News and information released in China by foreign news agencies shall not contain any of the following that serves to: (1) violate the basic principles enshrined in the Constitution of the People's Republic of China; (2) undermine China's national unity, sovereignty and territorial integrity; (3) endanger China's national security, reputation and interests; (4) violate China's religious policies or preach evil cults or superstition; (5) incite hatred and discrimination among ethnic groups, undermine their unity, infringe upon their customs and habits, or hurt their feelings; (6) spread false information, disrupt China's economic and social order, or undermine China's social stability; (7) propagate obscenity and violence, or abet crimes; (8) humiliate or slander another person, or infringe upon the legitimate rights and interests of another person; (9) undermine social ethics or the fine cultural traditions of the Chinese nation; and (10) include other content banned by Chinese laws and administrative regulations. Article 12. Xinhua News Agency has the right to select the news and information released by foreign news agencies in China and shall delete any materials as specified in Article 11 of these Measures. Article 13. To subscribe to news and information services of foreign news agencies, a user in China shall sign a subscription agreement with a designated entity and shall not, by any means, directly subscribe to, translate, edit or publish the news and information released by a foreign news agency. In using news and information from a foreign news agency, the user in China shall clearly indicate the sources and shall not transfer them to another party in any form. Article 14. Foreign news agencies and designated entities shall, within the prescribed time limit, submit reports each year to Xinhua News Agency on their work in releasing news and information and in acting as agents respectively. Xinhua News Agency may conduct examination and inspection on the basis of what is reported. Only those agencies and entities that have passed the examination and inspection are permit-

ted to continue with their news and information release and agency business. Article 15. Any unit or individual has the right to report to Xinhua News Agency any violation of these Measures. And Xinhua News Agency shall investigate and deal with the violation according to law. Article 16. Where a foreign news agency violates the Measures in one of the following manners, Xinhua News Agency shall give it a warning, demand rectification within a prescribed time limit, suspend its release of specified content, suspend or cancel its qualifications of a foreign news agency for releasing news and information in China, on the merits of each case: (1) releasing news and information beyond the scope of business as approved in the approval document; (2) directly soliciting subscription of news and information services, or doing so in disguised form; and (3) distributing news and information which contains the material specified in Article 11 of these Measures. Article 17. Where a user in China violates the provisions of these Measures in one of the following manners, Xinhua News Agency shall give it a warning, demand rectification within a prescribed time limit or order the designated entities to suspend or rescind the subscription agreement, on the merits of each case: (1) using the news and information from a foreign news agency beyond the scope as prescribed by the subscription agreement; (2) transferring to another party news and information from a foreign news agency that it has subscribed to; and (3) failing to indicate the sources clearly when using news and information from a foreign news agency. Article 18. Where a unit or individual violates the provisions of these Measures in one of the following manners, Xinhua News Agency shall submit a proposal to the relevant department of the State Council to impose an administrative penalty according to law: (1) releasing news and information without approval by Xinhua News Agency or subscribing to news and information of a foreign news agency without going through the entity designated by Xinhua News Agency; (2) distributing news and information of a foreign news agency or acting as its agent without approval; and (3) directly translating, editing or publishing news and information of a

foreign news agency without approval. Article 19. Where a designated entity, in violation of the provisions of these Measures, acts as an agent for distribution of the news and information of a foreign news agency that has not obtained approval of Xinhua News Agency, Xinhua News Agency shall order it to rectify, and disciplinary penalties shall be imposed on the persons directly in charge and the other persons directly responsible. Article 20. Where a staff member of Xinhua News Agency commits one of the following acts, Xinhua News Agency shall impose on him a disciplinary penalty: (1) issuing approval document to an applicant that does not meet the requirements specified in these Measures; (2) failing to perform his duties of supervision and administration in accordance with law; (3) failing to investigate and deal with violations of law upon receiving reports thereon; and (4) abusing his powers, neglecting his duties, or engaging in malpractices for personal gain, etc. Article 21. These Measures shall be applied mutatis mutandis to the release of news and information on the mainland by news agencies and other news and information releasing entities of the nature of a news agency in the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region, Macao Special Administrative Region and Taiwan. Article 22. These Measures shall go into effect as of the date of promulgation. The Methods for the Exercise of Administration over Publication in China of Economic Information by Foreign News Agencies and Their Information Subsidiaries, promulgated by Xinhua News Agency on April 15, 1996, are repealed simultaneously. (XNA, 10 Sep 06)

The General Office of the CCP CC has recently issued three documents concerning leading officials at county level and above, in a new effort to curb corruption. The three documents are the **Temporary Provisions on the Tenure of Leading Officials**, the **Regulations on the Transfer of Leading Officials**, and the **Temporary Provisions on the Avoidance of Leading Officials**. The CCP CC Organization Department is responsible for giving explanations to the documents. The General Office ordered local authorities and depart-

ments concerned to seriously implement the decrees, while bringing local realities into consideration. (XNA, 6 Aug 06)

The spouse, children and relatives of a person appointed to the leading official post in a government or party unit cannot be subordinate officials, accountants, auditors or human resources cadres in that unit during the official's tenure. The ban appears in a regulation issued on 6 August by the General Office of the CCP CC. Another important CCP regulation dealt with tenure of office and a third with job mobility. The three regulations apply to officials of the CCP Central Committee, the National People's Congress, the State Council, the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference, the Supreme People's Court and the Supreme People's Procuratorate, as well as local leading officials of party units, government departments, people's congresses and political consultative conferences, courts and prosecuting organs at and above county level. The new regulation said officials must not work in a government office that controls or supervises any industry or enterprise in which their family members hold shares. The regulation also stipulated that officials cannot take on the leading post in the CCP committee, government, court and prosecuting organs of the county and prefecture in which they are born and grow up. If officials fail to implement the regulation, they will be criticized or given disciplinary punishment. The regulation on tenure of office said officials should hold their posts for a term of five years to ensure stable and consistent implementation of policy. Officials must complete their five-year term unless they reach retirement age, are in poor health, fail to perform their duties and need to be transferred, or are demoted or dismissed for wrongdoing, said the regulation. When the five-year term is up, officials will be given an overall performance assessment of their work, and the result will be an important factor in future promotion, said the regulation. After working in the same post for two consecutive five-year terms, officials will no longer be recommended or appointed to the post, said the regulation. (XNA, 7 Aug 06)

Temporary Provisions on the Tenure of Leading Officials. The provisions consist of 15 articles. (Full text: RMRB, 7 Aug 06)

Regulations on the work of exchanges of leading party and government cadres. (Full text: RMRB, 7 Aug 06) Text of (Authorized for release) "Regulations on the work of exchanges of leading party and government cadres" carried by official Chinese news agency Xinhua Beijing, 6 August: Regulations on the work of exchanges of leading party and government cadres Chapter I: General principles Article 1: These regulations were formulated pursuant to the People's Republic of China Law on Public Servants, the Regulations on the Work of Selecting and Appointing Leading Party and Government Cadres, and relevant laws and regulations with a view to promoting the work of exchanges of cadres, further optimizing the leadership structure, improving leading cadres' quality and ability, stepping up efforts to improve party conduct and building clean administration, and promoting economic and social development. Article 2: These regulations apply to leadership members of the work departments and organs of the CCP [Chinese Communist Party] Central Committee, the National People's Congress Standing Committee, the State Council, the National Committee of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference [CP-PCC]; leading cadres of the internal offices of these work departments and organs; leadership members in deputy positions of the Central Commission for Discipline Inspection, the Supreme People's Court and the Supreme People's Procuratorate and leading cadres of their internal offices; local party committees, the standing committees of people's congresses, governments and CPPCC committees at or above the county level and leadership members of their work departments and organs; leading cadres of the internal offices of these work departments and organs; and leadership members of local commissions for discipline inspection, people's courts and people's procuratorates at or above the county level and leading cadres of their internal offices. Article 3: Exchanges of leading party and government cadres

mentioned in these regulations refer to reshuffles of positions of leading party and government cadres by party committees (leading party groups) at all levels and their organization (personnel) departments through transfers and reassignments within their areas of competence for cadre management. Separate regulations shall be formulated regarding the work of temporary assignments for the purpose of gaining toughening experience. Chapter II: Personnel involved in exchanges Article 4: Personnel involved in exchanges shall primarily include the following: (1) Those who need to undergo exchanges due to the needs of work; (2) Those who need to gain toughening experience and improve their leadership abilities through exchanges; (3) Those who have worked for quite a long time in a locality or department; (4) Those who need to be recused pursuant to rules and regulations; and (5) Those who need to undergo exchanges for other reasons. The key personnel involved in exchanges are leadership members in chief and deputy positions and other leadership members of local party committees and governments, as well as leadership members in chief and deputy positions of commissions for discipline inspection, people's courts, people's procuratorates and some work departments of party committees and governments, at or above the county level. Article 5: Leadership members of local party committees and governments at or above the county level who have served in the same positions for 10 years must undergo exchanges. With approval, restrictions may be appropriately relaxed for leading party and government cadres of ethnic minorities in autonomous ethnic regions. Those who have held the same party and government leadership positions for 10 years in the same areas shall undergo exchanges. Newly promoted local party and government leadership members at or above the county (city, district and banner) level shall take positions in a planned manner via exchanges from elsewhere. Article 6: Leadership members in chief positions of local discipline inspection organs (supervision departments), organization departments, people's courts, people's procuratorates and public security departments at or above the county level who have held the same

positions for 10 years must undergo exchanges; as a rule, the newly promoted shall take up their positions via exchanges from other places. Leadership members in deputy positions shall undergo exchanges after having served on the same leadership teams for 10 years. Article 7: Leading cadres at or above the division level in party and government institutions, especially leading cadres who are engaged in the work of discipline and law enforcement, cadre and personnel affairs, auditing, project review and approval, and fund management, shall undergo exchanges after having served in the same positions for 10 years. Article 8: Leading cadres at or above the county (division) level who lack experience of grassroots work or whose job experience is confined to one aspect of work shall undergo exchanges in a planned manner. Article 9: Leadership members in chief positions in units that practice dual cadre management with higher-level functional departments primarily exercising management shall undergo exchanges after having served on the same leadership teams for 10 years. Article 10: Exchanges of leading party and government cadres for purposes of recusal shall be carried out pursuant to relevant rules and regulations. Article 11: In any of the circumstances, exchanges of leading party and government cadres may be dispensed with or suspended: (1) Where less than five years remain from the age limits for the positions in question (the work of those for whom exchanges are mandatory may be adjusted in light of different circumstances); (2) Where exchanges are unsuitable for health reasons; (3) Where investigations by discipline inspection, supervision or judicial organs on suspicion of violations of discipline and the law are continuing with the conclusions pending; and (4) Where exchanges are inappropriate for other reasons. Chapter III: The scope and methods of exchanges Article 12: Cadre exchanges may be carried out among regions and departments, between localities and departments, and between party and government institutions on the one hand and state-owned enterprises, public institutions, civic organizations and mass organizations on the other hand. Article 13: As a rule, cadre exchanges at the prefecture

(department) level shall be carried out within the province (autonomous region or municipality directly under the central government), or, depending on the needs of work, may be carried out across provincial (autonomous regional or municipal) lines. As a rule, cadre exchanges at the county (division) level shall be carried out within the city (prefecture, autonomous prefecture or league). Depending on the needs of work, exchanges of county (city, district and banner) party committee secretaries and county (city, district and banner) magistrates may be carried out within the province (autonomous region or municipality directly under the central government). Article 14: Inter-regional cadre exchanges shall be carried out around state strategies regarding economic and social development and skilled personnel, local economic and social development setups, pillar industries and major development projects. Article 15: Central party and government institutions and provincial party and government institutions shall pay attention to transferring cadres with experience of local work, especially outstanding young cadres from party and government leadership teams in cities (prefectures, autonomous prefectures and leagues) and counties (cities, districts and banners), to positions in the institutions. At the same time, cadres from the institutions shall be sent to take up positions in localities in a planned manner depending on the needs of work. Article 16: Cadre exchanges shall be carried out between party and government institutions on the one hand and state-owned enterprises and public institutions on the other hand. Leading personnel from state-owned enterprises and public institutions shall be transferred to positions in party and government institutions, and leading party and government cadres shall be recommended to take up positions in state-owned enterprises and public institutions. Article 17: Leading cadres in units that practice dual cadre management with higher-level functional departments primarily exercising management may undergo exchanges within the same establishment. Exchanges may also be carried out with localities or other establishments. Chapter IV: Organizing implementation Article 18: Implementa-

tion of the work of cadre exchanges shall be organized pursuant to the areas of competence for cadre management. Depending on the needs of work, party committees (leading party groups) at higher levels and their organization (personnel) departments may also directly organize implementation. Cadre exchanges in groups between central party and government institutions and localities shall be carried out after coordination with the CCP Central Committee's Organization Department; individual cadre exchanges shall, in principle, be handled through consultations between transferring and receiving units. Cadre exchanges by departments that practice dual cadre management shall be proposed by the units that primarily exercise management, and the views of the units that assist in management shall be solicited. Article 19: As a rule, the work of cadre exchanges shall be carried out pursuant to the following procedures: (1) Organization (personnel) departments draw up exchange plans and nominate personnel for exchanges; (2) The views of transferring and receiving units are solicited; (3) Party committees (leading party groups) collectively hold discussions and make decisions; (4) Party committees (leading party groups) or organization (personnel) departments hold talks with the cadres involved in exchanges in order to hear their views and carry out ideological work; and (5) Organization (personnel) departments attend to transfer procedures. Article 20: Cadre exchanges shall be carried out through better planning and targeting with key areas given prominence, and attention shall be paid to combining them with change-of-term reshuffles of leadership teams. As a rule, party and government leadership members in chief positions at the city and county levels shall not undergo exchanges if they have not served out a term, and party and government leadership members in chief positions in the same area shall not undergo exchanges at the same time. As a rule, the number of members of a leadership team that are subject to exchanges shall not exceed one-third of the total membership. Exchanges of cadres who need to be elected or appointed or dismissed pursuant to statutory procedures shall be carried out pursuant to

statutory procedures. Auditing shall be conducted if auditing upon leaving office is required pursuant to relevant rules and regulations. Chapter V: Discipline in the work of exchanges Article 21: The following discipline must be strictly enforced for cadre exchanges: (1) All localities and units must enforce the decisions of higher-level party committees (leading party groups) regarding cadre exchanges and may not refuse to enforce them for any reasons. (2) Party committees (leading party groups) at all levels must strictly implement cadre exchange procedures and collectively consider and decide on the personnel involved in exchanges. They may not use cadre exchanges as a pretext to bring forth and promote cadres. No individuals may use cadre exchanges as a pretext to retaliate against cadres. (3) Cadres shall obey their organizations' decisions on exchanges. After receiving notification of exchanges, they must attend to procedures for handing off their duties as quickly as possible and report for duty within the specified time limits. Administrative ties and ties of party membership shall be transferred at the same time as interregional and interdepartmental exchanges. Cadres who refuse to accept their organizations' arrangements without legitimate reasons shall be removed from office or demoted locally. (4) Transferring units shall transfer the personnel files on cadres to receiving units as quickly as possible. They shall provide truthful information and data and may not engage in falsification. Receiving units shall review relevant data carefully. (5) When cadres are transferred, their staff members may not be transferred along with them in violation of relevant rules and regulations, nor are they allowed to take goods that belong to the public with them. Cadres may not interfere with the work of their original units after they have been transferred. Article 22: An accountability system for the work of cadre exchanges shall be implemented. Violations of discipline or laxity in enforcing discipline shall be subject to severe criticism and education; where serious consequences are caused, the persons with principal responsibility and other people with direct responsibility shall be brought to account. Article 23: Party committees (leading party groups) and their

organization (personnel) departments shall be responsible for supervising and inspecting the work of cadre exchanges, for receiving tips and complaints, for halting and correcting acts that violate these regulations, and for offering views or suggestions for dealing with relevant responsible parties. Chapter VI: Supporting measures Article 24: A sound mechanism of incentives for cadre exchanges shall be established. The integration of exchanges and training for employment shall be upheld, and policies and measures that are conducive to cadres' healthy development shall be adopted to encourage cadres to toughen themselves and make contributions in remote areas with hard conditions, in complex environments, and at key development projects and the grassroots level. Article 25: Party committees (leading party groups) and their organization (personnel) departments shall show concern and care for the cadres involved in exchanges, make proper arrangements for their work and lives, and bring their roles into full play. Units that transfer and receive cadres shall work with one another to help the cadres involved in exchanges resolve difficulties and problems and dispel their worries. Article 26: Whether or not the spouses and children of cadres involved in exchanges shall be transferred along shall be dealt with pursuant to relevant rules and regulations based on the cadres' wishes. Where spouses and children are transferred along, proper arrangements shall be made for their employment and schooling. Article 27: Party committees (leading party groups) and their organization (personnel) departments shall track the mentality and work of cadres involved in exchanges and strengthen education, management and supervision. Chapter VII: Supplementary articles Article 28: Cadre exchanges of trade unions, the Communist Youth League, women's federations and other civic organizations as well as public institutions affiliated with party and government institutions at or above the county level shall be carried out with reference to these regulations. Article 29: Localities and departments may draw up implementation measures on the basis of these regulations. Article 30: The CCP Central Committee's Organization Department shall

be responsible for interpreting these regulations. Article 31: These regulations shall take effect on the date of their promulgation. The Provisional Regulations on the Work of Exchanges of Leading Party and Government Cadres shall be abrogated at the same time. (Xinhua, 6 Aug 06, in BBC PF, 8 Aug 06)

Interim Regulations on the Avoidance of Positions by Leading Party and Government Cadres. (Full text: RMRB, 7 Aug 06) Text of (Authorized for Release) "Interim Regulations on the Avoidance of Positions by Leading Party and Government Cadres" by official Chinese news agency Xinhua (New China News Agency) Beijing, 6 August: Interim Regulations on the Avoidance of Positions by Leading Party and Government Cadres Article 1 These regulations were formulated pursuant to the People's Republic of China Law on Public Servants, the Regulations on the Selection and Appointment of Leading Party and Government Cadres, and relevant laws and regulations for the purpose of strengthening management and supervision over leading party and government cadres, ensuring the fair performance of duties by leading cadres, and promoting efforts to improve party conduct and foster clean administration. Article 2 These regulations apply to leadership members in the work departments and organs of the CCP [Chinese Communist Party] Central Committee, the National People's Congress Standing Committee, the State Council, and the National Committee of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference [CPPCC]; leading cadres in the internal offices of these work departments and organs; leadership members in deputy positions in the Central Commission for Discipline Inspection, the Supreme People's Court, and the Supreme People's Procuratorate as well as leading cadres in their internal offices; leadership members in local party committees, the standing committees of people's congresses, governments, and CPPCC committees at or above the county level as well as their work departments and organs; leading cadres in the internal offices of these work departments and organs; and leadership members in local discipline inspection commissions,

people's courts, and people's procuratorates at or above the county level as well as leading cadres in their internal offices. Article 3 Married couples, blood relatives, collateral relatives within three generations, and close relatives by marriage may not serve in positions directly under the same leading official or in positions with direct superior-subordinate relations in the same institution; nor are they allowed to serve in work related to organization (personnel), discipline inspection (supervision), auditing, and finance in an institution where one of the parties holds a leadership position. Article 4 Where a leading cadre's spouse, children, and children-in-laws operate enterprises or commercial people-run non-enterprise units in the form of sole proprietorships, partnerships, or substantial equity holdings, the leading cadre in question may not be a member of the leadership in a department that exercises industry regulation or functional supervision over said enterprises or units. Article 5 Leading cadres may not serve as the chief leadership members in county (city) party committees, governments, discipline inspection organs, organization departments, people's courts, people's procuratorates, and public security departments in the places where they grew up. As a rule, they may not serve as the chief leadership members in city (prefecture and league) party committees, governments, discipline inspection organs, organization departments, people's courts, people's procuratorates, and public security departments in the places where they grew up. The provisions of the preceding paragraph shall be used as reference with regard to ethnic leading cadres in ethnic minority areas that practice autonomy. Article 6 Where there is a need for avoidance at the time a leading cadre takes office, the organization (personnel) department shall present its views on avoidance to the party committee (leading party group) for decision pursuant to the areas of competence for cadre management. If necessary, the organization (personnel) department may ask the leading cadre in question to report on the circumstances that warrant avoidance in the position to be taken. Article 7 Where circumstances warranting avoidance arise during a leading cadre's term of of-

fice, the cadre in question shall file an avoidance application. If the party organization of the unit in question finds circumstances that warrant avoidance, it shall make an avoidance suggestion and, after verification by the organization (personnel) department, present its views to the party committee (leading party group) for decision pursuant to the areas of competence for cadre management. Article 8 Individuals and organizations have the right to report circumstances warranting avoidance by leading cadres. Agencies that receive said reports shall forward them to relevant organization (personnel) departments for handling pursuant to their areas of competence for cadre management. Article 9 Where circumstances warranting avoidance mentioned in Article 3 of these regulations arise, as a rule, the party that holds the lower-grade job shall avoid the position if the grade levels of the jobs involved are different; if the grade levels are equivalent, the avoiding party shall be decided according to the needs of work and the actual circumstances. Article 10 Where avoidance requires cross-regional or cross-departmental adjustments that are difficult to arrange at the level in question pursuant to the areas of competence for cadre management, the organization (personnel) department at the higher level shall be requested to coordinate efforts to seek a resolution. Article 11 Where leading cadres elected by people's congresses need to avoid positions in specific areas, adjustments shall be made during their terms of office in light of the actual circumstances if said adjustments can be made during their tenures; if adjustments are difficult to make during their terms of office, said adjustments shall be made after their terms of office expire. Article 12 Before presenting their views on avoidance to party committees (leading party groups) for decision, organization (personnel) departments may hear the views of the leading cadres in question and relevant personnel. Article 13 Leading cadres who do not report in a timely manner or who intentionally conceal circumstances warranting avoidance shall be criticized. If the circumstances are serious, they shall be disciplined by their organizations. Article 14 Leading cadres must obey avoidance

decisions. If they refuse to obey without legitimate reasons, they shall be removed from office or demoted in their original places of work. Article 15 Other than the circumstances spelled out in Articles 3, 4, and 5 of these regulations, where other laws and regulations provide for the avoidance of positions by leading cadres, said provisions shall apply. Relevant departments shall formulate separate regulations regarding the avoidance of positions by leading cadres in the country's agencies abroad. Article 16 Party committees (leading party groups) at all levels and their organization (personnel) departments shall be responsible for organizing the implementation of these regulations, for supervising the implementation of the system of avoiding positions by leading party and government cadres, and for remedying acts that violate these regulations pursuant to their areas of competence for cadre management. Article 17 The avoidance of positions by leading cadres in trade unions, the Communist Youth League, women's federations, and other civic organizations as well as in public institutions affiliated with party and government organs at or above the county level shall be carried out with reference to these regulations. Article 18 The party committees of provinces (autonomous regions and municipalities directly under the central government) shall formulate measures regarding the avoidance of positions by leading cadres in townships (towns and neighbourhoods) on the basis of these regulations. Article 19 The CCP Central Committee Organization Department shall be responsible for interpreting these regulations. Article 20 These regulations shall come into force on the date of their promulgation. (Xinhua, 6 Aug 06, in BBC PF, 9 Aug 06)

Beijing, 5 September: The Chinese government on 5 September issued **new rules aimed at tightening land supply** in another bid to prevent overheating of the economy. The new rules warn local leaders that they will be penalized if they fail to stop or investigate illegal land sale cases in areas under their jurisdiction, according to a State Council notice. Under the new rules, the use of farm land for construction purposes will no longer

be approved by the State Council for each project, but should be reported to provincial governments and submitted to the State Council for approval on an annual basis. Land management authorities must keep a closer watch on local governments and stop land supply applications from local governments that may breach regulations, according to the notice. Civil servants who have violated the land supply rules shall be disciplined and prosecuted if they have broken the law, the notice said. The Ministry of Supervision in collaboration with the Ministry of Land and Resources and other central departments shall soon launch a nationwide crackdown on irregularities in land supply, the notice said. China recorded an economic growth of 10.9 per cent in the first half of this year on the back of a 30-per cent growth in fixed asset investment, both the highest in recent years. In its bid to prevent a possible economic meltdown, China has repeatedly raised the benchmark interest rate and clamped down on unauthorized investment projects. The government believes that illegal land supply is a leading cause of the runaway investment. A survey of 16 cities by the Ministry of Land and Resources last year showed that nearly 50 per cent of the new land under development was acquired illegally. The figure was as high as 90 per cent in some cities. (XNA, 5 Sep 06)

Beijing, 5 September: Chinese police are no longer allowed to shackle drunks or put children, elderly, pregnant women or breast-feeding mothers involved in non-criminal cases into custody. The Ministry of Public Security recently published the revised **Regulations on the Procedure of Handling Administrative Cases by Police Departments**. Under the Regulations, police can use belts in stead of handcuffs to control drunks who might cause a public disturbance. Drunks should not be shackled when being questioned after they are sober. People between the ages of 14 and 18 who are charged with violating public security regulations for the first time, women who are pregnant or breast-feeding a baby younger than a year, and elderly people 70 and older can not be detained for minor offences. Children 14 and 16

should be exempted from administrative punishment, but their guardians will be ordered to better supervise them. Punishment for those between 14 to 18 could be reduced. According to the revised Regulations, once the suspects are issued a summons, police should timely inform their family of the charges via short messages (SMS), fax or phone calls. The revised regulations went into force on August 24. (XNA, 5 Sep 06)

The PLA [People's Liberation Army] General Staff Department recently promulgated the "PLA Regulations on the Wartime Support Given by the Armament Maintenance Units and Detachments", the "PLA Regulations on the Armament Warehouse Wartime Support", the "PLA Regulations on the Wartime Support Given by Armament Repair Factories", and the "PLA Regulations on the Wartime Support Given by the Special Armament Service Units and Detachments". These regulations provided concrete, real-war-oriented and standard legal guarantees for the performance of support tasks by various types of armament support detachments in wartime. This indicated that the legal system for the wartime armament support had basically taken shape in our armed forces. For the first time, the four sets of regulations comprehensively standardize the armament support actions of the armament maintenance units and detachments, the armament warehouses, the armament repair factories being run as enterprises, and the special armament service units and detachments at all levels in the future military operations under the condition of informatization. They constitute an important component part of the new operation regulation system and armament legal system of our armed forces, and provide the basic grounds for all types of armament support units and detachments at all levels to organize wartime armament support and arrange training. The four sets of regulations clearly specify the status and role, the main tasks, the guiding concepts, and the basic principles of wartime armament support, standardize the basic procedures, methods, and requirements for the armament support actions in various campaign and battle stages, and also specify the re-

lationships and the actions that need to be coordinated. They give expression to the features and rules of the joint operations in the future local warfare in the form of informatization. The four sets of regulations stipulate that when organizing armament support, all types of armament support units and detachments must follow the guidance of Mao Zedong Military Thought, Deng Xiaoping's thinking on military force building in the new period, Jiang Zemin's thinking on national defence and military force building, and Chairman Hu's important theses on military force building, must carry out the military strategic principle for the new period, carry forward the fine tradition and style of our armed forces, flexibly organize and use the support forces, give full play to the overall support strength of both the military and civilian sectors and of all arm branches and services, comprehensively provide timely, efficient, sustained, and stable armament support for operation actions, especially for the priority operation actions.
