This publication includes basic data on the MoND Budget expenditures for 2003 in various charts and comparative tables. The macroeconomic data concerning the MoND Budget as well as the other State Budget expenditures are based on the 2003 Budget Act. The information also includes a comparison between Poland's and other European states' defence expenditures. The publications used for the purpose of the international comparison were "Military Balance 2003/2002" and NATO's statistical tables.

According to the 2003 Budget Act, the Budget of the Ministry of National Defence (as Part 29 of State Budget) amounts to MPLN - 15,135.6.

Furthermore, within *the targeted reserves* that are provided for under the state budget (category 83), additional resources have been assigned for the Defence Ministry for the following purposes:

- implementation of the multifighter aircraft programme for the Polish Armed Forces
- an amount of MPLN 230.0;
- support for the restructuring of the defence production capacity in the industry and support for technical modernization of the Armed Forces
- an amount of MPLN 66.8; and
- •- additionally, from *the special funds of the Ministry of Defence* (following the deduction of the remittance to the national budget in an amount of MPLN 5.6)

 an amount of MPLN 107.2.

This implies that the resources available to the Ministry of Defence this year (the funds allocated to be expended under the state budget together with the targeted reserve funds and the special funds) will amount to **MPLN 15,539.6**, corresponding to **7.99%** of the state budget and **1.98%** of the GDP projected for 2003, which conforms to the formula established in 2002, in the "Guidelines of the Council of Ministers Concerning Defence Planning and Programming in the Years 2003-2008."

The aforementioned financial resources will be further supplemented with expenditures related to the defence tasks of other ministries and provinces under the "Non-military Defence Preparations Programme," in an amount of MPLN 41, thereby adding up to a total of MPLN 15,580.6.

The year 2003, will be the first year of implementation of the programme for the development of the Armed Forces of the Republic of Poland in the years 2003-2008. The priorities set out by the Ministry of Defence include tasks related to the technical modernization of the Armed Forces and the participation in NATO structures.

The largest share of the MoND Budget expenditures directly concerns National Defence. These expenditures are included in section 752 which makes up 64.9 % of the Budget. A relatively large share of expenditures - around 25.65% is allocated for disability pensions and retirement benefits served to former professional soldiers. Other expenditures (altogether around 9.45%) were budgeted to cover: higher education (2.33%), schooling (2.24%), housing (2.12%), public administration (0.97%), health care (0.52%), protection of national heritage & cultural activities (0.59%) and the remaining expenditures (0.68%) covering social welfare, administration of justice & public prosecutor's office, other social activities and public services (MPA).

In section 752 - "National Defence" -48.6% of the expenditures are assigned for the Army, 23.35% - for Air Forces and 10.12% for the Navy. The remaining part of expenditures (17.93%) are divided into 8 subsections comprising: "Central Support", "Liaison offices for NATO & military personnel in NATO", "Military Intelligence Services", "Military Police", Chaplain offices and "Other units".

The main specific categories under the Defence Ministry's budget for 2003 include the following: personnel (32.5%), pensions (23.3%), maintenance and training (29.6%), and equipment and infrastructure.




NATIONAL DEFENCE PRIORITY TASKS FOR 2003


STRUCTURE OF MoND BUDGET FOR 2003 IN SECTIONS

(without reserves)




STRUCTURE OF MoND BUDGET

(with reserves for multifighter aircraft)



(constant prices 1995)





Note:

In comparison with other countries, and the "older" NATO members in particular, the situation of Poland may appear to be relatively unfavourable. However, taking into consideration the purchasing power of the Polish zloty (PLN), the Polish defence spending per capita would translate into a higher figure, amounting to approximately USD 170 (to a similar extent, this also applies to the Czech Republic and Hungary).




